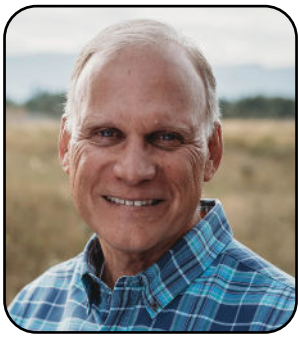

PARLIAMENTARY CORNER

TYPES OF MEETINGS (PART 1 OF 6)

There may be an occasion when it is not possible for an assembly to complete its work in the allotted time. The assembly can schedule an adjourned meeting for a particular time and place by the adoption of a main or privileged motion “to fix the time to which to adjourn.” An adjourned meeting is scheduled before the next regular meeting and takes up its work at the point where it was interrupted, except that the minutes of the preceding meeting are read first. Sometimes this meeting is referred to as “an adjournment of” the regular meeting. *This usage should not be confused with the act of adjourning.*

There are two types of annual meetings. 1) The ABRN holds only one business meeting of the general membership each year. The Executive Board is responsible for the management of the organization’s business between these meetings. 2) Some organizations hold regular business meetings but one of these meetings is designated as the annual meeting and is given over to annual reports of officers and standing committees, the election of officers, and other business, as prescribed in the bylaws. Minutes of the annual meeting are read and approved at the next regular meeting.

Develop an Estate Plan to P.A.S.S. the Test

As the new year begins, it is important to emphasize planning one's estate. As Christians we are called to be good stewards of God's resources. What are some key components needed to **P.A.S.S.** the test of having a good Christian estate plan?

Provide for the Financial and Guardianship Needs of Dependents. First Timothy 5 reminds us of the importance of providing for one's family. Permanent guardianship of minor children is principally delegated to the Last Will and Testament (Will). It is suggested that the same guardian be identified in the Wills of both parents. When a person uses a Revocable Living Trust as their primary estate document, permanent guardianship issues should be addressed in the "pour-over will" to cover the disposition of anything which has not or cannot be placed in the trust. Wills only become enforceable at death when probate procedures are initiated. Temporary guardianship issues, if parents become incapacitated and unable to care for children, are often handled through an estate planning document known as a Durable General Power of Attorney.

Assign property to individuals and/or ministries that honor God by being about His Kingdom work. As followers of God's Word, we recognize that God is the owner of all things. Psalms 24 and Romans 8 remind us that we are co-heirs with Jesus. Therefore, any effective estate plan should involve a provision for recognizing and continuing the Lord's Kingdom building work. The specific ways in which one's estate carries out Kingdom building is reserved to the prayerful discretion of the individual.

Seek to Transfer Property in an Efficient Manner. Simply taking the steps to establish core end-of-life documents such as the Will, Durable Power of Attorney, and Advanced Healthcare Directives serve to create efficiency. Taxes can also be minimized within this context when considering tools such as Charitable Remainder Trust or Charitable Gift Annuities. Instruments

such as these can be an excellent tool to furnish supplemental income to the individual or family members, and provide estate tax savings, while ultimately passing to God-honoring ministries.

Speak to a faith in Jesus Christ. Proclaiming one's faith in Christ is central to identifying as a Christian, as outlined in the great commission in Matthew 28 and Acts 1. Including a written testimonial to the reality of Christ in one's life is strongly encouraged. While this can be incorporated into the legal documents of the Will or Trust, often a non-legally-binding "side letter" can be used. A Testator (the drafter of the Will) or the Grantor (the drafter of the trust) often wish to speak in a personal way about their faith and the rationale of their estate plan, without encumbering the legal documents. The universal characteristic underlying all effective Christian estate plans is to acknowledge the Giver of Salvation, and the preeminence of the Lord in life. All blessings, both large and small, come from the Lord.

IMB 2022 year in review: Together, we reach the nations

Over and over, the International Mission Board sees examples of Southern Baptists coming together to take the gospel to every nation. The cooperative efforts have never shone brighter than this year. Churches set a record with their generous giving. The Lottie Moon offering was the largest in the 177-year history of the IMB with \$203.7 million.

IMB president Paul Chitwood reminded those attending a [sending celebration at the Southern Baptist Convention in Anaheim, California](#) that 100% of this offering goes to sending and equipping missionaries, just like it has since the beginning. In fact, 25,000 missionaries have been sent to the nations throughout the 177 years. Now, more than 3,400 missionaries are on the field in 2022 engaging the 4.7 billion least reach peoples.

“They need us, Southern Baptists. They need you,” Chitwood told the SBC audience back in June. “This is why we came together, and this is why we must stay together.”

Southern Baptists send IMB missionaries to be present among those who have never heard the gospel. As the IMB looks back on 2022, they saw each of their top stories for the year pointed to this commitment.

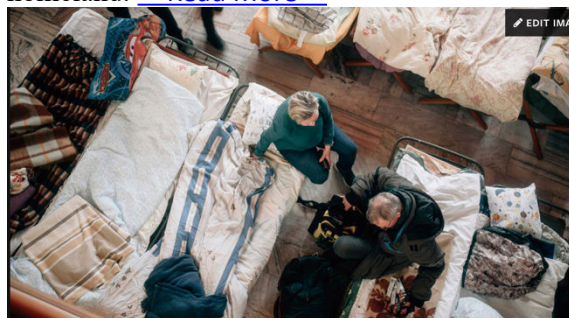
Gospel Access

The IMB believes missionary presence helps cultivate gospel access that knows no boundaries. This has never been more apparent than in the countries surrounding Europe this year. As the conflict between Ukraine and Russia elevated and refugees flooded into neighboring countries, [we were there to help](#) — physically, emotionally and spiritually. A decades-long partnership with Romanian, Moldovan, Ukrainian and Russian Baptists allowed Southern Baptists to not only be among the first to respond but to be there for the long term. More than \$10 million was raised by [Send Relief](#) for Southern Baptists to use in 72 different relief projects related to this war. While that is impressive, the best part is how quickly churches responded to a need and joined national believers and churches already at work.
