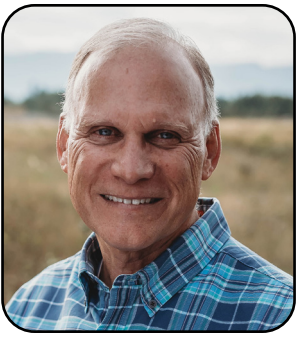

Because of our common love for Alaska, we exchanged contact information and I began following the ministry of the Belmores through their newsletter.

I had little expectation that we would someday be living and serving the Lord together in Alaska. When we returned, I was anxious to meet with Scott and discuss ways of encouraging each other in ministry. Mosaic Campus Ministry was in its early days of formation and I was excited to support and assist the work of campus ministry at UAA. We developed a deep love and appreciation for the Belmore family as we got better acquainted with them and their children, Andrew and Ruthie.

Scott and I have met many times in coffee shops talking about how to engage college students and involve them in Kingdom work in Alaska. I love his passion and love for students! One year ago, Scott called and asked to meet with me about something which he wouldn't men-

tion on the phone. My first thought was they are leaving Alaska. I was ready to give him the "don't do it" speech when I learned they were pursuing appointment with the International Mission Board (IMB). How could I discourage them from following God's leading to focus on students in London? Having been a part of the European Affinity group, I knew all too well the need to engage European students with the gospel and to mobilize them to reach the next generation.

On February 2 in Richmond, Virginia, Scott and Dana Belmore were appointed by the IMB along with 50 other new appointees to take the gospel to the ends of the earth. They will be moving to London in June. Yes, we will miss them here in Alaska. They served well at several churches, most recently through True North Church in Anchorage as an elder/leader. But we can be proud that we have another couple from Alaska along with those who currently serve with the IMB to not only represent Southern Baptists, but Alaska Baptists. I encourage you to pray for them regularly and follow their ministry. They will need your support, encouragement, and your prayers as they lead out in student ministry in the UK. We should also include Brock and Megan Langley and Nathan and Summer Barkley in prayer as they carry on the work of Mosaic Campus Ministry throughout the University of Alaska campuses.

# Short terms of service provide multiple pathways to mission field

Kristy Phillips\* had pondered applying to serve with the IMB since she was a teenager. She thought about it, prayed about it, and even filled out the application forms. Still, she could never bring herself to submit them.

Every time she considered it, doubts began to creep in. In her late fifties, Phillips already endured several career changes, and the idea of shifting to ministry overseas seemed like an even bigger leap.

"Lord, they're not going to want me. I don't have anything to offer," she remembers praying as she wrestled with the decision.

She now looks back on that season and laughs as she marvels at how God has worked in her life. Not only did Phillips accept a three-year role in Panama with a church-planting team, but in April of 2021 she began another three-year term in Southeast Asia. The IMB worker who encouraged her to finally hit send on her application is her team leader.

She never dreamt of serving in two countries. But when God began to open doors, His leading was clear both times.

Part of what gave Phillips the flexibility to serve in two different places was a mid-term pathway called International Service Corps. Through this pathway, an individual can serve for two to three years on missionary church-planting teams. No college degree or seminary credits are required. Although the terms are fixed at two to three years, they can be renewed.

Opportunities to serve in this capacity are requested by team leaders to fill specific needs. For example, Phillips's current role is coordinating logistics for sending national believers on short-term trips to search for Unengaged Unreached People Groups and building prayer support for UUPGs.

"I would encourage other people to do it," she said. "It's a great opportunity to serve the Lord."

Matthew and Kristi Gillespie\*, who also serve in Southeast Asia, echo Phillips's sense of urgency and gratitude for how short-term opportunities simplified their process to get to the field. They are both part of the Macedonia project, a three to four year term that combines online seminary training with ministry on a church planting team. The Macedonia project is for individuals who have a long-term call but no seminary training yet.

This means that the Gillespies weren't required to delay ministry overseas for several years to complete the IMB's seminary requirements, something that appealed to them.

"We felt like [Macedonia] was the quickest way to get on the field and still get seminary, which we valued," said Kristi. "We're thankful for it."

The Gillespies met in college and agreed early in their relationship that they both felt called to overseas work. Though their first term has come with many unexpected challenges, they both said they are grateful for an opportunity to gain real world experience while they finish seminary.

Matthew said balancing classes, language learning and ministry is difficult, and that there have been many late nights over the past few years. Though it's challenging, they are often able to directly apply what they learn to their ministry, which is a blessing.

While they were taking an evangelism class, they had many chances to share the gospel in the heart language of the people group they served. They talked often with a server at a café near their house who was struggling with prolonged separation from her husband and daughter due to COVID-19 border closures.

She became a good friend, and they found out several months after moving away she had become a Christian.

For Matthew, her story illustrates exactly why they didn't want to lose any time on the field while they finished seminary training.

"The best thing about [Macedonia], from our perspective, is that we wanted to be with the people, and it doesn't take you away from that," he said.

The Gillespies plan to finish their term in December of 2022, graduate from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary in the spring of 2023, and then return to Southeast Asia as career missionaries.

Phillips said she isn't sure yet what the future holds after she completes this term, but she would encourage anyone, no matter their season of life, to listen when God calls them.

"You're never too old to serve the Lord. If He's calling you, you need to go," she said.

### From Louisiana to Alaska to the nations

Scott and Dana Belmore both became aware of missions through [Royal Ambassadors](#) and [Girls in Action](#) programs in their churches as kids. While they felt called to ministry, it wasn't until college, in the Baptist Collegiate Ministries, that they became persuaded of God's call on their lives to be mobilizers.

They've lived out that calling in their roles in state missions, national missions, and now international missions.

The Belmores worked with college students, discipling and mobilizing them to go to the nations, through the Louisiana Baptist Convention and later the North American Mission Board in Alaska. The next place they're following the Lord's leading is to London, to mobilize and disciple students there through the IMB.

"I ask, 'God, why do we get to be a part of this bigger picture you are trying to do?'" Scott said. "We just count it a blessing and a joy and an honor to get to be a part of what He's doing all across the globe."

The Belmores are being sent out from True North Church in Anchorage, Alaska.

They ask for prayer for their family as they transition, specifically for their daughter, Ruthie, who is 16 and will be moving with her parents and their son, Andrew, who is 20 and will be staying in the U.S. to continue studies.

- for undergraduate students

- must have good membership standing with a recognized congregation of the Alaska Baptist Resource Network (see brochure for specifics)
- maximum amount of scholarship \$1900 (see brochure for specifics)
- must have a complete scholarship packet submitted by April 30, 2022 (see brochure for specifics)
- maximum of 10 scholarships awarded for 2022

## Parker Scholarship:

- for seminary/graduate students (see brochure for preapproved list of schools)
- must have been an Alaska resident for at least one year
- must have good membership standing with a recognized congregation of the Alaska Baptist Resource Network (see brochure for specifics)
- maximum amount of scholarship \$5000 (see brochure for specifics)
- must have a complete scholarship packet submitted by April 30, 2022 (see brochure for specifics)
- maximum of five scholarships awarded for 2022 based on fund availability

## Reynolds Scholarship:

- for seminary students
- for men who have surrendered to preach after the age of 25 or any applicant man or woman pursuing ministry work after the age of 25
- amount depends on funds available typically only enough for one individual
- contact The Alaska Baptist Foundation for more information and/or receive an application
- no specific due date established. Awarded on a first-come first-served basis upon review and approval of the applicant and their submitted application materials

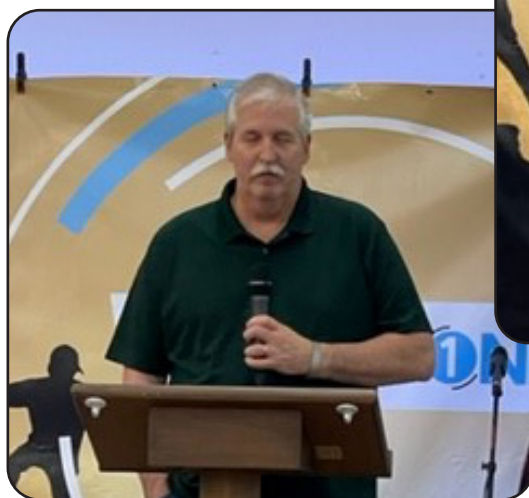

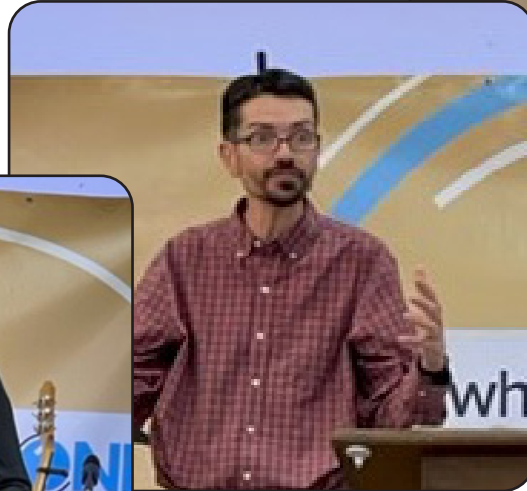

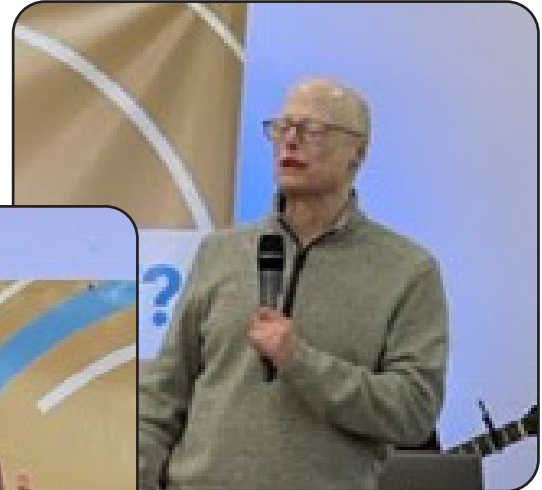
