PRAY FOR UKRAINIAN PEOPLE

The events that have transpired over the past several weeks in the Ukraine have disrupted the lives of most of the inhabitants of the world. While the greatest atrocities have been absorbed by the Ukrainian people in their own homeland, the entire globe has felt the aftershocks of this military conflict. My heart breaks, not only for Ukrainian citizens who did nothing to provoke this attack, but also for the millions of Russians who now experience isolation and derision from the rest of the world.

Robin and I served in Russia for 14 years as IMB missionaries to the Russian Far East. Many of the young men and women with whom we served were from the Ukraine. Ukrainian evangelical churches have propagated one of the greatest missionary forces to the nations in the Eastern hemisphere. The Russian people have been the largest recipient of these missionaries and owe a great deal of gratitude to Ukrainian believers.

Christianity first came to this part of the world in 988 when Volodymyr the Great who, ruled Kyivan Rus, because a Christian. He installed Christianity as the state religion and decreed that all subjects must be baptized and become members of the state Church. While the Russian Orthodox Church became the religious arm of Imperial Russia for the intervening centuries, German Mennonite, Anabaptist believers and Stundists from Germany immigrated into the Ukraine. Along with them came a fire for studying the Word of God and evangelizing the inhabitants of Ukraine. This is one of the first vestiges of Evangelicalism in eastern Europe. Of course, during the Soviet era, evangelical Christianity was suppressed by the leaders of Communism.

When the Russian incursion of the Crimean peninsula began in 2014, annexing major ports to the Black Sea in southern Ukraine, local believers began a prayer vigil for their nation and the nations of the world. They have gathered faithfully for nearly 3000 consecutive days on the main square in front of the administration building in Kharkiv to pray together. Even during the recent bombing of that city, Ukrainian believers have been faithful in praying.

NOW IT'S OUR TURN! It's time for western believers to intercede on behalf of these defenseless citizens of a great nation who are in desperate need. I encourage you to pray in the following ways:

1. That God will redeem the situation and bring many Ukrainians and Russians to faith in Jesus Christ;
2. For evacuation and humanitarian relief efforts for the Ukrainian people;
3. For the churches of Ukraine to be faithful in serving their people physically and spiritually;
4. For a swift cessation of aggression and egregious contempt for human life;
5. For the leaders of involved nations to hear a word from God and act accordingly;
6. For relief workers to have the strength and stamina through daily horrors to provide comfort and peace to weary evacuees;
7. For protection of innocent children and families who are still in harm's way;
8. For believers to remain strong and not give in to fear and desperation.

Thousands of Ukrainian Christians find solace in Polish Baptist church

“Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest.” Matthew 11:28 (NIV)

This verse embodies Chelm Baptist Church’s response to Ukrainian refugees who have made long and arduous journeys out of their homeland and who are burdened by the loss of life as they knew it in Ukraine.

The Polish city of Chelm is located 16 miles from the border of Ukraine. Pastor Henryk Skrzypkowski and members of Chelm Baptist Church opened the Christian Transit Center for Ukrainian refugees and have received more than 2,000 refugees. The center has beds for 200 people, and their registration desk and kitchen are open 24 hours. Many of the refugees come in the evening, seeking shelter and a place to sleep. The church also supplies necessities. Some refugees stay for a warm meal and a rest before their journey onward. Refugees are directed to Polish Baptist camps in other cities.

Sasza is one of the many refugees who found solace in the center. Sasza traveled to Chelm at the beginning of the exodus and before the enactment of martial law, which requires men 18 years and older to remain in Ukraine. The 20-year-old Polish believer came to the Christian Transit Center with his sisters and mother. His father remained in Ukraine to fight.

Sasza’s family has since moved to another city in Chelm, but Sasza remained at the center as a volunteer. He receives arriving refugees. He speaks Ukrainian, some Polish and English and bridges language barriers for other volunteers.

“His attitude is encouraging for all of us here. He never takes praise for himself, but gives all the glory to God,” Joanna Marcyniak, a Polish Baptist volunteer, said.

Marcyniak attends a Polish Baptist church in the city of Poznań and traveled to volunteer her time to manage the church’s Facebook page and post updates.

In addition to serving those who come to them, this week the church sent two cars to the border with medication and food.

On March 6, for the first time in the church’s history, Chelm Baptist Church’s Sunday morning service did not take place in their sanctuary. To continue the ministry of the Christian Transit Center, the service took place in Chelm’s Community Center. The worship service opened with “Amazing Grace.”

The lyrics of the third verse were apropos for Ukrainian refugees.

*Through many dangers, toils and snares
We have already come
T’was Grace that brought us safe thus far
And Grace will lead us home*

During the service, Skrzypkowski spoke from Matthew 14, where Jesus fed the 5,000. He said we might be tempted, like the disciples were, to send people away.

This stood out to Marcyniak.

“Jesus didn’t send the hungry people packing. Even though we might have a temptation to wash our hands of the responsibility, it’s not what Christ teaches us. We want to be closer to Jesus and the kingdom of Heaven, not to this world,” Marcyniak said

Skrzypkowski shared in his message what stood out to him was how Jesus organized the feeding. Jesus instructed the disciples to organize the crowd into smaller groups to provide for their needs. The church in Chelm is working toward this, and the call extends globally, Skrzypkowski said. He called for unity and organization in the days and weeks to come.

“We have to organize ourselves. I don’t mean just Chelm, I mean

the whole Christian world,” Skrzypkowski said.

“We have to employ more people,” he continued. “We have to build relationships and cooperation in the countries where refugees are going – Latvia, Germany, the United States and other countries. They have to trust us, and we have to trust them, that the people are going to join you through our ministry, that they are going to be safe, and that they are going to have a new life.”

During service, church members had the opportunity to listen to volunteers visiting from the U.S., Latvia and Ukraine. Austin Duffey, from NewSpring Rally Church in Anderson, South Carolina, and Justin Brenenthul, from Grace Baptist Church in Brunswick, Ohio, spoke.

Both were among the first volunteers to arrive.

Thomas, a representative from the Baptist Union of Latvia also shared.

“When I arrived here, I was just amazed at what you guys have done. You have transformed your church into a house of hope and love,” he said. “The volunteers and staff work tirelessly.”

“Maybe it really took a tragedy like this to wake up the sleeping giant that is the Church of Christ, I am just happy we are united by this love that we have received from God and that we can serve others in need,” Thomas said.

Thomas shared from Matthew 25:37-40. “Then the righteous will answer him, saying, ‘Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? And when did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? And when did we see you sick or in prison and visit you?’ And the King will answer them, ‘Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.’”

Thomas encouraged those present at the service that they were living out these verses.

“Everything that you do has eternal value – all the cooking, all the cleaning – and I believe the Ukrainian people can see and feel that. Although they are frightened, scared, panicked and worried, after a day or two staying in your church, they are relaxed; they are welcomed. That is the kingdom of God.”

The church was not charged for the use of the center on Sunday.

The community – mostly non-Christian – in Chelm rallied behind the church. A pharmacy provides medicine free of charge. Hotels and restaurants provide food at no cost, and others have volunteered their time and services.

“We can see people from all over this town are moved by the scale of actions of this church,” Marcyniak said.

Church members and Christians frequently gather to pray for Ukraine in the church’s sanctuary. Prayers and songs are voiced in multiple languages – Polish, Ukrainian, Latvian and English.

“We want to encourage one another with the Word of God and confide in His grace and unlimited mercy. We sing, listen to testimonies, and together we entrust our worries and everyday struggles to Him,” Marcyniak said.

Chelm Baptist Church asked for Christians to join them in prayer for the following:

- Good organization of Polish churches, so refugees can be safely and properly housed
- Communication with the Western world as well as with Ukraine.

“God is providing us with strength, and we are grateful for each one of your prayers,” Marcyniak posted on the Facebook page.

“For the Lord’s portion is his people.” Deuteronomy 32:9a

Have you ever thought of yourself as part of God’s estate and legacy?

The Bible reminds us of our inability to seek after God and His righteousness because of sin (Psalms 53:1-3 and Romans 3:10-19). The message of hope as pictured by the gospel is the life given by God the Father through faith (Ephesians 2:8-9) in Jesus Christ the Son, as Lord and Savior. The evidence of which is seen in the indwelling light of God, the Holy Spirit. We are not only the Triune God’s estate, but represent His legacy having a position of family (Romans 8:15). **Is there a responsibility/work associated with being part of God’s legacy?**

Ephesians 2:10 says we are God’s handiwork created in Christ Jesus for good works which God established for us to fulfill, in His providence and appointed time. While some works may be tailored to a specific individual based on God’s providence, God’s expectation is for Christians to work together as a unified body of believers (First Corinthians 12). This unity of the local church provides strength, encouragement, and integrity in fulfilling good works.

The bride of Christ, both as the Universal church (Church) broadly, and the local church, specifically, as a body redeemed in the light of God, produces the Fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23). This fruit is the ability to fulfill the principal works of Christian ser-

vice, namely to follow God’s commands in love (John 14:15; Matthew 28:18-20; Acts 1:8).

Christians are given the instruction to be a beacon of God’s light to the world. (Matthew 5:16). In the context of being this perpetual light it is important that we continue to reflect God’s light to the world. The Church can only be a reflection of what we are individually.

Consider the benefits of a **Legacy Inspired God Honoring Trust (LIGHT)** fund. A local church of believers could establish a LIGHT fund as a form of estate planning/legacy giving. Giving a tithe on a \$500,000 estate (\$50,000) may not seem like much, but when you combine this with 20 or more church members who have a unified vision for advancing the light of the gospel, there is an exponential impact.

The specific ministry and evangelistic characteristics which make up a LIGHT fund can be uniquely tailored to the ministry passions of any local church. In this way the local church takes part in the service to the greater function of the Church which finds its fulfillment and purpose in the person of Jesus Christ demonstrating its love by glorifying God and serving to advance His Kingdom.

Let’s let the light which is in us as Christians shine, not only today, but for all the tomorrows to come with the help of tools like a LIGHT church fund.
