



Who Are Your State Missionaries? the value of the Cooperative Program

As we gathered to celebrate the 75th anniversary of Alaska Baptists last month, I was reminded of what Felton Griffin shared at the organizational meeting in 1946. He identified three basic reasons for the purpose of the Alaska Baptist Convention:

- 1. That the work might be unified;
- 2. That they might **encourage** one another;
- 3. That any **future Baptist work** might be welcomed and tied in with the work already established.

Our current vision for the Alaska Baptist Resource Network is to be people who **Abide** in Christ, **Build** the Kingdom of heaven on earth, and **Cooperate** in one sacred effort. Our vehicle for doing that is the Cooperative Program (CP).

The Cooperative Program was established in 1925 by the Southern Baptist Convention (SBC) as a way to pool God's resources in a unified sacred effort to evangelize our homeland and extend the gospel to the ends of the earth. The Cooperative Program has been the most efficient way in the history of Christianity to fulfill the Great Commission. Alaska Baptists have faithfully participated in the Cooperative Program since its inception.

Over the next few months, I will be sharing some of the things we have seen God do because of our faithful giving through the Cooperative Program. The first thing I want to highlight is missionary support at home. CP funds provide monthly support for missionaries serving all across America. The

percentage we send to the Southern Baptist Convention is distributed to several entities of the SBC, one of which is the North American Mission Board (NAMB), formerly known as the Home Mission Board. These funds support thousands of missionaries/church planters establishing new work in reached/unreached areas of our country. Some of these funds come back to the state to assist with local support combined with support provided through the Alaska Baptist Resource Network (ABRN).

So, you might ask, "Who are our state missionaries?" While partial funding is provided by NAMB for support of church planters in Alaska, the ABRN fully funds three full-time state missionaries: Randy Covington, Jimmy Stewart, and Jae McKee. They are your missionaries called to serve and supported by CP funds sent to the state convention. Collectively, they serve Alaska Baptist churches in church planting, mission engagement to the unreached places, evangelism and church strengthening. They travel the entire state in order to preach, teach, and encourage the ministry in every corner of our state.

Acts 1:8 gives us our marching orders. We are called to reach our city and state (Jerusalem and Judea) as well as our nation and our world (Samaria and ends of the earth) for the sake of the gospel. It begins at home and extends to the darkest corners of the world. The Cooperative Program allows us to do that together.

Destination Dig

Who would have thought that archeology could lead people to Christ? That is exactly what LifeWay is doing with this year's VBS. It will be a theme based on digging for the truth. The actual theme is "Unearthing the Truth about Jesus!" The scripture comes from Jeremiah 29:13. Here is what Lifeway says kids will do this summer through Destination Dig.

"VBS 2021 is headed to present-day Israel where discovery awaits at Destination Dig. Kids will unearth more than dirt as they dig up exciting evidence that proves biblical events were not just stories. As junior archaeologists, kids will explore real-life archaeological finds that have helped to uncover the truth about Jesus! Along the way, they'll discover the truth of Jeremiah 29:13, that God reveals Himself to us when we seek and search for Him with all our hearts."

Every April we help churches prepare and plan for the summer's VBS by holding VBS Clinics throughout the state. Last year we were in the midst of COVID. We had one clinic online. I was very pleased to see a number of churches participate. With technology we were able to hold the conference completely online and even have breakout times for all of the participants. COVID is still impacting our lives, but we now understand how to hold meetings and keep everyone safe. We will have the clinics where in-person instruction can take place, and we will still have an online training event. We have found, thanks to a pandemic, we can have training for everyone in our state using Zoom. It worked well last year. It gives us an opportunity to connect with the most distant places in our state through computer or phone. We have been able to take the team but to a few locations. Through technology, anyone can access our training. So, if you are not able to attend in person, attend by Zoom.



<u>Individual Retirement Accounts</u> (IRA'S) are products designed for long-term tax-advantaged investment savings. The two most common are the Traditional IRA and the Roth IRA. Outlined below is a comparison of key distinctions and benefits of each.

Traditional IRA* (Established 1974) Roth IRA* (Established 1997)

Offers income tax deduction for each year a contribution is made.	No income tax deduction for contributions.
Is subject to a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) after the account owner reaches the age of 72 (under current law).	No RMD is required to be paid out while the original account owner lives.
Most distributions are subject to income tax at the account owner's ordinary income rate even after reaching the minimum age of 59 ½.	Potentially, account owner contributions can be accessed without tax penalty. Further, as long as the account owner has had a Roth for five years and is over 59 ½ all distributions of earnings and principal are income tax-free.

^{*}For 2021 contribution limits are \$6000, \$7000 for individuals over the age of 50.

**Traditional IRA better if one:

**Roth IRA better if one:

Anticipates the income tax rate will be lower in retirement than while working.
 Anticipates needing to lower current taxable income to avoid increasing healthcare cost. Such as keeping Obama-care credits or avoiding higher Medicare B premiums.
 Anticipates a lot of years before Retirement.
 Anticipates another individual will inherit much of the IRA account balance.
 Anticipates the need for flexibility in the use of the funds.

- *** RMD distributions can bypass income tax as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). At least, four key provisions must be met for funds to qualify as QCD:
- 1. Must be given to a 501(c)(3) eligible organization. Most churches qualify.
- 2. The account owner must be at least $70 \frac{1}{2}$ years of age.
- 3. The QCD offset is limited to the MRD on a per year basis. There is a \$100,000 annual limit per individual.
- 4. The funds must be transmitted from the account investment company custodian, directly to the charity, bypassing the account owner.

^{**} Not every wage earner can benefit from the Roth. The IRS currently imposes Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) limits in order to take advantage of a Roth IRA. AGI limits are far more favorable for Traditional IRAs except, when an individual has an employer offered retirement plan such as a 401(k) or 403B.


- for undergraduate students

- maximum amount of scholarship \$1800 (see brochure for specifics)
- must have a completed scholarship packet submitted by April 30, 2021 (see brochure for specifics)
- maximum of 10 scholarships awarded for 2021

Parker scholarship:

- for seminary/graduate students (see brochure for preapproved list of schools)
- must have been Alaska residents for at least one year
- must have good membership standing with a recognized congregation of the Alaska Baptist Resource Network (see brochure for specifics)
- maximum amount of scholarship \$5000 annually.
- must have a completed scholarship packet submitted by April 30, 2021 (see brochure for specifics)
- maximum of five scholarships awarded for 2021 based on fund availability

Reynolds Scholarship:

- for seminary students
- for men who have surrendered to preach after the age of 25 or any applicant man or woman pursuing ministry work after the age of 25
- amount depends on funds available typically only enough for one individual
- contact The Alaska Baptist Foundation for more information and/or receive an application
- no specific due date established awarded on a first-come first-served basis upon review and approval of the applicant and their submitted application materials
