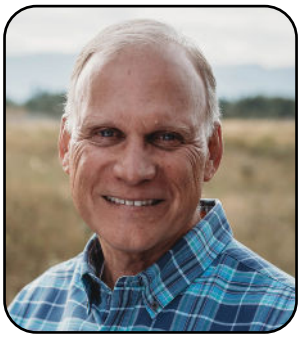

Unity and Diversity

Ephesus is one of the cities we read about in several books of the New Testament. I was so intrigued by the city's history when we lived along the same coastline of the Aegean Sea, assuming I would one day visit the ancient site of Ephesus. It never happened! We left Europe before we had the chance to visit. Having seen Philippi many times, I greatly appreciated walking where Paul walked and reading the NT verses that were birthed in this ancient soil.

Paul's epistle to the Ephesians contains many lessons that most likely were borne out of the two years of teaching in the lecture hall of Tyrannus (Acts 19:8-10). Paul systematically begins teaching about God and the powerful work of Christ and the Holy Spirit through the redemption of a lost world. In chapter two, he addresses the purpose for those who have received the immeasurable riches of his grace in verse 10; ***"For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared ahead of time for us to do."*** (CSB)

The church at Ephesus was a multi-ethnic church made up of Jews, Greeks, Romans, Macedonians, Africans, and other nationalities. Rome recognized it as the capital city of Asia Minor and appears to have been a church planting center for Galatia and Phrygia. While this significant population diversity was indicative of the Kingdom of God on earth, finding unity in the church's work was difficult. Much of what was learned on individual faith journeys was influenced by cultural backgrounds vastly different from others. This created somewhat of a dilemma for the church.

Paul sought to emphasize the words of Jesus as he prayed to the Father in the upper room the night before his crucifixion: ***"May they all be one;"*** (John 17:21). He encouraged the Ephesians with these words: ***"Therefore I, the prisoner in the Lord, urge you to walk worthy of the calling you have received, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to one hope at your calling—one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all."*** (Ephesians 4:1-6 CSB)

I've often wondered how it is possible to have unity in diversity. We see this clearly displayed in the trinitarian nature of God. Even though there is one God, one Lord, and one Spirit, they function in diverse ways but never in opposition. No doubt they are perfect, and we are not, but our calling as image-bearers and Christians is to become like them.

Alaska Baptists, though very diverse in many ways, have always found ways to unite in one sacred effort to expand the Kingdom of God in our state and local community. There is still much work to be done, and we do it best when we do it together, united in love for one another and maintaining the bond of peace. Let us focus on our common identity in Christ, our shared experiences and values, with mutual respect while celebrating the rich tapestry of lives He is weaving together in His church.

We NEED staff, minimum of 10-12 volunteers

We have an almost full roster of Summer Missionaries, including two local ladies who are former campers! That's amazing. We have two more with camp experience coming from Louisiana, as well as our kitchen assistant and admin assistant.

Our first work teams show up in the first and second week of May and they are going to accomplish a host of great things.

Native Youth Camp is on the go with our long-term team partners ready to give another great season of service. JAM Camp is also on track for a blockbuster year as well as a work team from the same church at the same time who will start on the SNOW HILL PROJECT!!!

This will be followed by Greatland Christian which is a large camp event, which will be followed by our new friends at a large local ministry, which will also be a large camp experience and, prayerfully, a long term partnership.

There are some events happening right now and have been this "Spring", as well as a number of smaller events and work teams after the camping season.

Unfortunately, we still have a gigantic, heart-breaking hole for our three main camps, all in the month of June. After our previously committed teams from last Fall pulled out in mid-March due to their inability to gather enough people for teams, I have had dozens of contacts and conversations around the counter and in Alaska, with no results to report, at this point. By the end of next week, we will need to make a decision based on what is or is not developing. My recommendations to our board are as follows:

1. First pivot: Move YOUTH CAMP from the first week of June to the last week of June and combine both KID'S CAMPS into ONE WEEK during the third week

of June. We can attempt to gather enough of a local team to have limited capacity camping opportunities for both of those camps, based on leadership numbers. We would, of course, need to notify all currently registered campers and offer refunds for those who could not make those adjustments work.

2. Second pivot: Cancel those three weeks of camp altogether, or some of them, should we have adequate staffing to host one and not another.

If we have to cancel, based on last year's numbers, we are looking at an approximately \$30K loss of revenue. Some of that will be offset by the addition of other events in July and increased work team engagement, but I think the best we can hope for is a loss of some kind compared to last season.

If you know of any local bodies, churches, or individuals who would be up for being part of a volunteer team to be the mission staff for any of the summer camps in June, send them my way.

Even a team of 10-12 would allow us to do something. It may require leaning on some of our local pastors and other ministry staff to serve as camp pastors for worship times and I may be spending a great deal more time at the camp than I intended. That would be a significant hardship in some ways, but we've fought too hard to recover from the disaster of 2020 not to think proactively.

I appreciate you all! You have been an amazing encouragement and insightful resource over some rough times. Thank you!

Easter Video from Missionary Leads to Long-term Discipleship of Teenager

A stranger slid into Carina Beaty's Instagram DMs. The message would open not just chat windows but doors to discipleship Carina couldn't have imagined

when she and her husband decided to open their apartment windows three years ago.

On Easter Sunday in 2020, Caleb and Carina Beaty stood by their windows and began playing worship music that echoed through the central courtyard of their Madrid apartment complex. Heads leaned out of the windows of apartments surrounding the IMB missionaries.

While their concert led to conversations with neighbors, new friends, invitations to neighbors' houses and times of fellowship, the Beatys say the most substantial result happened because of [an IMB story written about the event](#).

Not long after the initial story was posted, a woman messaged Carina on Instagram to say she watched the video on the IMB website and explained she had a Spanish exchange student living with her in Arkansas. The high-school student needed to return to Spain because of COVID-19 lockdowns in the U.S. A month before her return date, the student committed her life to Christ. The Arkansas Baptist learned they lived in Madrid and wanted to know if she could connect them so the student, Maria, could be discipled.

Upon Maria's return, Carina connected with the young teenager. She learned Maria had attended a Christian school in Fort Smith, Arkansas. Despite the town's small population, the school welcomes many international students.

Students at the school take Bible classes, and international students take a class that gives an over-arching story of the Bible.

Her host family faithfully shared the gospel with her.

"They shared the gospel with me so many times, and I remember just thinking, 'can this possibly be true?'" Maria told Carina.

"She told me the Lord appeared to her one night in a vision and said, 'Everything that they're telling you is true,'" Carina said.

That's when Maria knew she needed to put her faith in Him.

Carina and Maria's friendship deepened. Three years later, they continue to meet for discipleship. Maria joined a small group Bible study the Beatys started in their home, and she was introduced to churches in Madrid.

She's invited her family to their small group as well, and at Thanksgiving, her dad met the people investing in his teenage daughter every week. Maria's mom, sister and grandmother attended church with Maria, too.

Carina led Maria and her friends through a seeker Bi-

ble study, and rich conversations resulted. Maria didn't stop at invitations to Bible studies, she's brought a friend to church and frequently shares with her neighbors, classmates, teachers, aunts, grandparents and cousins.

Carina is amazed at the conversations she's able to have with people around her. Maria is 17 now, and like Timothy in the New Testament, she doesn't let anyone

look down on her because of her age. She has the courage and obedience to make His name known.

The Holy Spirit uses Maria to spiritually encourage Carina during their times of discipleship.

“The Spirit is working in her heart and growing her faith, and it’s been so encouraging to see that fruit,” Carina said.

Carina said this connection was “not because of anything that we’ve done. It’s the Lord working, and it just happened that her host mom saw our video and got in touch with me.”

Maria kickstarted the Beaty’s ministry. Caleb and Carina had arrived in Madrid just ahead of the COVID-19 lockdowns, so the early days of their missions’ career looked quite different from what they envisioned.

“So much of our evangelism and discipleship and our small group has come out of the relationship with Maria,” Caleb said. “Nobody really asked us about our faith directly because of [our Easter 2020 concert], but the Lord has used it to deepen relationships and to meet Maria all the way via Arkansas.”

You can join Caleb and Carina by praying for their ministry.

“Pray we have eyes to see the opportunities to share with people in our neighborhood and bold-

ness to speak the words we ought to, and for the Lord to keep working,” Caleb said. “He’s working in ways we hadn’t expected.”

Pray for continued boldness for Maria and that the Lord would strengthen her faith daily. Pray the people Maria is sharing with will have open hearts.

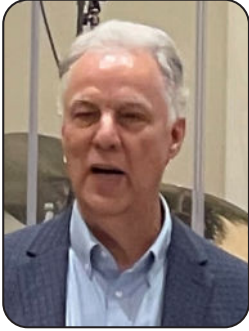

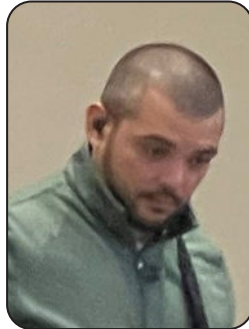

PARLIAMENTARY CORNER

TYPES OF MEETINGS (PART 4 OF 6)



A **regular meeting**, also called a stated meeting, refers to the periodic business meetings of a permanent organization. These can be held weekly, monthly, or quarterly, the day (such as the first Sunday of the second month of each quarter) should be prescribed in the bylaws. The hour and place of meeting should be fixed in the standing rules. Policies and Procedures *are* the standing rules of an organization that has no specified standing rules. In organizations holding frequent meetings for social, cultural, or worship purposes, the term *regular meeting* applies particularly to the regular business session.

A **special meeting** is held at a different time from a regular meeting and is convened only to consider matters specified in the call of the meeting. Notice of the meeting must be sent to each member as outlined in the bylaws. Special meetings can only be called if authorized in the bylaws. The bylaws must prescribe by whom the meeting is to be called, and the number of days' notice required. The only business that may be conducted at the special meeting is that specified in the call to meeting.
