





Sitting on a Pumpkin

We're a little more than halfway through 2020 and what a ride it has been!

Church attendance online has spiked to an all-time high, many churches are reporting more attendees than when they were meeting in person and others are reporting an increase in weekly Bible studies and small group meetings via Zoom and other social media platforms.

Amid all of the adjustments and adaptations we've been forced to make, it is possible that some of us have been nudged (or pushed) off of our proverbial pumpkin and forced onto the crowded velvet cushion of the internet and social media.

"I would rather sit on a pumpkin and have it all to myself, than be crowded on a velvet cushion." Henry David Thoreau

Our routines have been disturbed. Our systems have been rewired. Our approaches have been altered.

But our mission and our message remains the same.

In the book of Acts we see how the Apostles and believers, once indwelt with, and empowered by, the promised Holy Spirit, began acting and functioning much like the local church that we are familiar with today (Acts 2:42-47).

Then the early church began to experience persecution, imprisonment, death and dispersion from the very culture that was called to be the people of God.

Forced to scatter from the religious center of Jerusalem, believers went throughout Judea and Samaria and even unto the uttermost parts of the earth (sound familiar? **Acts 1:8**), beginning the fulfillment of the Christ's words.

Most of us have been forced to re-evaluate our concept of "church." We like the fellowship, the predictability and the "what-to-expect" when we "go to church." We are less than fans of social-distancing, mask-wearing,

no-coffee-served, and no-potlucks service-in-the-parking-lot style of church.

It's not our pumpkin anymore.

Perhaps God has removed our pumpkin so that we will begin to engage with our neighbors.

Perhaps we have focused too long on comfort over calling.

The fear of death has never been more evident than it is today. We have the mission and the message that conquers all fear.

The early church was dispersed and run out of town in order to fulfill the calling that Christ had given them, and has also given us.

I liked my pumpkin, but pumpkins were made to share, not sit on.

The people of Alaska desperately need a relationship with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Can we find new ways to share His love today?

The first 20 years of this century have seen unprecedented change. Technology and the proliferation of the internet have impacted the ways individuals communicate and relate to each other globally. These changing dynamics also affect the broader financial markets, as we see a more volatile worldwide system. When annualized, the last 20 years of the S&P 500 market index show an average return of about 4.3 percent. There is no easy answer to the question of financial security, but there are fundamental biblical principles which stand the course of time. One of the most fundamental of those principles is to give. As Christ gave himself on our behalf we are to give ourselves for God's glory. The earlier in one's life the principles to GIVE are introduced, the better, but it is never too late to start.

Giving- The most important lesson in biblical stewardship to teach and apply, is the truth that God is the owner of all things: all our time, all our talents, and all our treasures. Since God has shared his abundance with us, we have the responsibility to share with others. This sharing includes meeting physical needs but, most importantly, involves spiritual wellness through advancing the work of His kingdom.

Investing-Start by teaching the concept of saving. Opening a bank account with regular deposits will teach saving. Discuss the broader concept of investing in such things as stocks and bonds. One needs to be familiar with basic concepts, such as diversifying investments (using more than one type), managing risk, saving consistently over time and the benefits of compound interest to help money grow. One of the core principles of finance discussed in the Bible is to avoid debt wherever possible. This is a form of gaining by not losing.

Valuing - Individuals need to understand the relationship between work and money. Consider assigning your children responsibilities for which they receive compensation based on completion. There is a great life lesson in knowing that, with hard work, you can purchase something you want — and that you may have to wait for that purchase until enough savings have accumulated. This can be a far more effective tool than just giving an arbitrary allowance. The biblical teaching that human beings were designed to work and contribute is demonstrated. This practice helps mitigate the moral hazards that creep into a society when a sense of entitlement takes hold. Remember, the presence of sin is subtle—it disguises what is wrong as something that seems right and good. Sin creates interdependency disguised as compassion.

Educating – Educate young children in the basics of what money looks like and the names and values associated with coin and paper monies. Later, move to the cost of items, differentiating between needs and wants. Explain the value of an item versus the price of the item to help a child determine whether it is a good use of the resource. Help them develop their own personal budget, being responsible for some expenses. As they mature, begin to teach them about credit cards and the danger of reckless borrowing. Education can begin at any time in one's life, however much evidence demonstrates that the effects have greater impact and are more integrated into behavior the earlier one starts.

Is it any wonder why we have such volatile situations in life, financial and otherwise, when we do not follow the principles God has laid out in His Word? We should never succumb to the fear of our circumstances but rather, rely on the hope and certainty of our faith. We must continually feed on the substance of God's Word and the edification of prayer and fellowship to guard us against the enticement of sin which plagues all flesh




