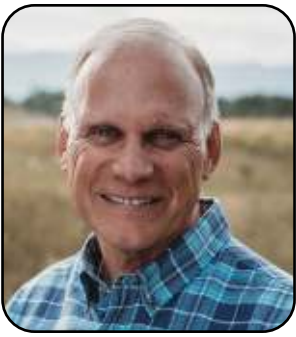

The Cooperative Program (CP) Support Entities of the SBC

The Cooperative Program (CP) is the fuel for most of the ministry entities of the Southern Baptist Convention (SBC). While state conventions are autonomous and not considered entities of the SBC, a percentage of the funds given through the state convention, remain in the state to support the work of evangelism, church planting, and mission advance in the local state. Alaska retains 80% of the funds for local ministry and forwards 20% to the national convention to be applied across these entities for missional engagement worldwide and through the SBC seminaries.

SBC Executive Committee—The Executive Committee of the SBC serves as the fiduciary, fiscal, and executive entity of the Convention. Ronnie Floyd currently serves as the President/CEO of the Executive Committee, however the committee itself is made of members from all of the individual state conventions. Todd Burgess from First Baptist Church, Eagle River serves as Alaska’s representative to the SBC. While the business of the SBC is conducted annually by its messengers from the churches at its annual 2-day meeting, the Executive Committee handles the administrative duties throughout the year when the convention is not in session. CP funds support the work of the SBC Executive Committee.

Ethics and Religious Liberty Commission (ERLC)—The ministry assignment given to the ERLC is “... to be a catalyst to connect the agenda of the kingdom of Christ to the cultures of local congregations for the sake of the mission of the gospel in the world.” This commission represents the Biblical and Christian moral values of Southern Baptists to governmental and political institutions within the United States of America. This entity receives CP funds and is in the process of searching for its next president.

Woman’s Missionary Union (WMU)—The WMU is not an entity of the SBC but an auxiliary that “assists churches in developing and implementing a comprehensive strategy of missions in order that a church can fulfill its total mission in the world.” They help to promote mission offerings such as Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for International Missions as well as Annie Armstrong Easter Offering for North American missions. They receive no CP funds and are led by Sandy Wisdom-Martin as its executive director-treasurer.

LifeWay Christian Resources—LifeWay not only provides printed publications for Bible study, devotional, and Christian education and discipleship, but also assists in organizing training events and designing learning experiences for churches designed to fuel local ministry. As its materials are sold to the public, it receives no support from the Cooperative Program. Ben Mandrell is the current president of LifeWay.

GuideStone Financial Resources—GuideStone “exists to assist the churches, denominational entities, and other evangelical ministry organizations by making available retirement plan services, life and health coverage, risk management programs, and personal and institutional investment programs.” Just like LifeWay, the funds generated by services offered totally support the work of GuideStone through its investments and requires no support from the Cooperative Program. O.S. Hawkins has served the past 25 years as president/CEO of GuideStone but will soon retire and Hance Dilbeck will become the new president/CEO.

Plan for Fall

What are your plans to jumpstart and build momentum in Bible study classes/groups for the Fall?

Summer is always a great time in Alaska. Groups may have taken a break this summer or just been less attended. We all know how crazy our summers can get. But, in a few weeks people will start settling into more of the routine we get into as we welcome cooler temps. Are your class/groups leaders looking forward to the excitement that comes from ministry through studying the Word? Have you, as the pastor or group leader, set schedules, enlisted leaders for the team, secured places for groups to meet whether on site or in homes and ordered materials as needed? Here are a few things to consider in making preparations for Fall studies.

Help your leaders to...

1. Consider having a high attendance or back to groups emphasis for the fall. Reach out to all of your people on the membership role and to visitors who attended in the past. Offer special classes with different topics of interest.

2. Enlist a **T.E.A.M.** to help in the functioning and community of the group. **T.E.A.M.** leaders are a **T**eacher, an **E**vangelism/outreach leader, an **A**ctivities/Assimilation leader and a **M**inistry leader. I have information to share about groups with this type of structure and can suggest leader responsibilities. If you are interested and want to share with your leaders, contact me. I am available to come and train your leaders in putting together a team. Groups have greater impact when they become a community of leaders and attendees. It allows us to involve more people in ministry and discipleship. It helps us discover and train more people in our congregations to use their gifts in service.

3. Strengthen teaching techniques. We all need to polish

our skills from time to time and consider if our format, teaching plans or presentations have become too routine or less exciting. A few tips about teaching gives the opportunity to touch base with leaders and challenge them in their teaching. Encourage leaders in their commitment to prepare and utilize resources that help in their teaching. There are gifted people in your congregations that may have trained professionally as educators. Tap that resource to help your teachers.

4. Offer a variety of classes that appeal to the broad needs of your congregation. New classes tend to grow faster than existing classes. Some groups may be of a size that warrant birthing new leaders into a new group. Make it a priority, with emphasis from group leaders, to encourage members to step up to the leadership challenge. Testimonies from leaders and class members about the many benefits of being in a community group should be shared in services. Prayer times could focus on the upcoming emphasis of growth through groups. Information and advertising will promote existing and new groups that are starting. Don't leave it to chance or a supernatural work that has to happen before new groups get started.

We are starting a quarterly Zoom meeting for Bible group directors and leaders. It is a time for encouragement and helping each other as leaders. Contact me for more information on this quarterly meeting and get your leaders involved. Also, please contact me if you would like help with a Fall emphasis.

Put February 3-4, 2022, on your calendar for this will be our State Evangelism Conference. First Baptist Church, Eagle River will host this year. I am excited about the tremendous folks coming this year. This is my 20th State Evangelism Conference and it will be a great event for all of us.

A cup of coffee and a new creation

"If I ever write a book, the title will be, 'The Day Jesus Walked into My Coffee Shop,'" Jose* said with a smile.

Ben and Christy Prater, Baptist representatives, grinned also as they remembered that first encounter at a Jerusalem coffee shop. Little did they know that each of their lives would intersect and ultimately be a testimony of the power of salvation.

Jose and his wife, Juanita*, were Spanish speaking immigrants to Israel, working in a newly opened coffee shop when Ben and Christy walked in that spring evening.

Weeping at first

"I had just finished a phone call from the States," Christy said. "And the news was not good. My mother was dying."

Trying to process and make decisions about the situation, the couple talked quietly as Jose came to take their order. Tearfully, Christy forgot about her sadness for a moment when she felt compelled to engage in conversation with Jose.

By the time they had finished their coffee, they had met Juanita and their two children. Although Juanita was Jewish, Jose confided that he acted like he was Jewish to conform to the traditions of keeping the coffee shop kosher. Latinos immigrating to Jerusalem may seem unusual, but today Israel is home to more than 100,000 Hispanic Jews. They fled their homeland to escape persecution, to find financial security or to be part of a larger Jewish community.

After this first visit, Ben and Christy continued to stop in for coffee, deepening their connections to the family. They were invited to birthdays, barbeques and shared visits in each other's homes.

"We learned that Jose didn't know if he believed in God or not," Christy said. "We never missed an opportunity to talk about our faith, sharing Scriptures and stories with the family."

After returning from Christy's mother's funeral, they continued to show faith in action by painting rooms, building items for the shop, moving the family closer to the coffee shop – sharing life.

Two years later, when the Praters returned to the U.S., they faced a bleak vacation because Christy's father and sister died suddenly. Grief engulfed them, but their faith remained strong.

Joy in the morning

"Jose and Juanita pondered from a distance, wondering how we could handle such loss and sorrow," Christy said.

Non-believers struggle to understand the hope found in faith, but Jose knew something was different about Ben and Christy, and he called them in the U.S.

"I want what you have!" he blurted out.

"I want the peace you have. I believe Jesus is the Son of

God and that He died for my sins and rose again, and He is coming back to take us to heaven."

Joyfully returning to Israel to prepare Jose for baptism, the Praters knew Jose would have struggles as a new believer.

"Problems did arise," said Christy. Juanita became distant and detached, the coffee shop closed, and Jose's two biopsies were positive for cancer.

Yet, God was faithful. Jose found a better job, and the doctor declared a miracle when the next biopsy was negative.

Another year passed and Jose was determined to live a faithful life by taking his family to meetings with other believers. At one of these gatherings, Ben talked about the healing power of faith when Juanita slowly walked over to Christy and gave her a hug.

"I want you to know that I believe in Jesus now," Juanita whispered.

Christy was stunned.

"What did you say?" She asked Juanita to repeat the words. Then Juanita explained to the Praters why she wanted to be in God's family.

"I watched you. I listened to the faith stories. I saw that my husband was a different man," she said. "I want to be part of the wonderful family of God."

She was baptized, followed by her daughter, Isabella*. Recently Yoel*, their son, also became a believer. Now they are witnessing to relatives and friends in Australia, Uruguay, Spain and at home in Israel.

It started with a cup of coffee but after seven years, Jose and Juanita are fearless believers, boldly sharing their faith.

"The whole family is a testimony to the power of salvation," Christy said. "What a story of the Father's faithfulness and a community of believers!"
