Cooperation--The Heartbeat of Southern Baptists

Cooperation is defined by Merriam-Webster as *the actions of someone who is being helpful by doing what is wanted or asked for; an association of persons for common benefit*. The funding program of the Southern Baptist Convention which was established in 1926 is appropriately named the Cooperative Program (CP). It has been the heartbeat of Southern Baptists working hand-in-hand in a focused mission effort.

I learned about the Cooperative Program when I served in my first church in Anchorage and began giving my tithe to that local church. I was immediately convinced of how effective this funding model was for accomplishing mission work in Alaska through the association, the state and national conventions. When I attended seminary, I was surprised to discover the CP literally assisted seminary students with tuition. My appreciation was significantly broadened as it was a blessing to a poor seminary student struggling to make a living for my family and pay for school.

My deep regard for the CP was elevated when I was called to serve as a missionary in Russia and received my support through the International Mission Board (IMB). In 22 years, I never worried about financial support for my family or for the ministry of church planting and development. I was thankful for every opportunity I was afforded

to speak to churches and express my undying appreciation for their faithfulness in giving to the Cooperative Program and the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering.

Part of my responsibility as a state convention leader is to promote Christian stewardship and provide oversight for the use of CP funds statewide and at the national level. The broad picture that I now have only serves to strengthen my support of the Cooperative Program.

However, I have a great concern that the concept of cooperation has become somewhat ambiguous to some people.

Cooperation must begin with and maintain the essential elements of collaboration, communication and mutual understanding. There are also the elements of accountability and mutual respect. If any of these elements are lost, then cooperation is lost. There is no room for coercion, control, or rulership in a cooperative relationship. Let's not forget that Southern Baptists have been blessed of God in our cooperative efforts to reach our world for Jesus Christ. Christ prayed that **"they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us, so that the world may believe you sent me."** (John 17:21)

That should always be our heartbeat; the heartbeat of Christ himself.

Focusing on the Positive

Many people have let this current pandemic get them down. They deny the reality of the situation, or become angry because things are out of their control. Many have felt a sense of loss and many have experienced real loss. There is economic loss, health loss, death, freedom loss and loss of relationships. In the midst of this pandemic, we find ourselves trying to cope, reorganize and reclaim our lives. After my burn, I have been on a journey of dealing with grief. There are stages of grief and it is a constant ebb and flow of emotions—a continual journey. One event can change your life and give you a “new normal.” I still experience stages of grief.

The first stage of grief is often denial. I denied that I would be changed as a result of the accident. I am very thankful for all I am able to do, but there came a point reality set in. I wanted to heal and get back to life as normal. I didn’t know that there would be a “new normal.” It has been amazing to see my body heal, but it has taken longer than I expected and the damage done to my largest organ, the skin, has an on-going effect. I am still in therapy, still struggling with aspects of tightening skin and some pain. On the bright side, my pain is way down, my mobility is way up and energy once used for healing is now used on the racquetball court and cutting the grass.

Another stage in the cycle of grief is anger. Although I don’t consider myself an angry person, I recognize an underlying anger ready to bubble up when frustrations come trying to use hands that don’t function the same. I drop things, and can’t open things like I use to. My dream of being the oldest American Ninja Warrior are on hold for now.

Depression has been a companion along this journey with grief. I reject the temptation to focus on loss and try to discipline myself to focus on what I have. No one is promised a rose garden and I certainly am better off than many in a similar situation. God’s compassionate, attending presence has been a companion that I’d rather spend time with than depression. God’s Spirit speaking through the saints is encouragement that has empowered me through the toughest experience of my life.

The grief cycle includes bargaining and acceptance. I have found new meaning and greater impact of ministry through sharing my story and reaching out to others in pain. I have had so many opportunities to share with strangers. Accepting this new normal is not what I want to do, but,

slowly I am returning to joy. Joy comes from getting into the finals of a racquetball tournament again, playing piano to assist in a worship service, spending time with family on hikes and other activities. Joy in the midst of ministry is even more meaningful.

COVID-19 is an event in all of our lives and many are going through some or all of the grief cycle. Unless you are a centenarian, you have not experienced a pandemic of this scope. Although there have been events in our lifetime, such as wars, that have had major effects on economies and life, COVID-19 has truly changed our lives, especially church life. Has all that has happened been negative? Can anything positive come from this? If we focus on the positive and do not allow ourselves to be angered by the loss of liberty, we might find some interesting things to be positive about. The future could have blessings in store. Family time has been increased. Peer pressure has diminished. Families have re-prioritized their spending and saving habits. People miss going to church but they are still giving. God’s people are faithful. God is still in the saving business. I read an article about an outdoor revival attracting large numbers and people being baptized. Technology has been a great blessing as we find new ways to learn, minister and give. Churches have found that reaching out to communities through benevolence is having a greater impact. There is more openness to spiritual conversations than before.

What is God saying to the Church? We need to be the Church. When driven out of synagogues, the first Christians met in homes and flourished. When persecuted, the church thrives. What does God want us to do as a result of authorities telling us we can’t meet? It never has stopped the Church before in human history and it shouldn’t now. As long as we have life, we ought to never stop going and never stop contacting people. We will speak out, meet, bless, minister, and pray more than ever before. God’s Church will prevail and never be stopped. We trust in the unstoppable God and His Spirit. We can’t focus on past models but must be creative to be the Church. We cannot become trapped in a cycle of grief but look at the opportunities this new normal brings. Dream again and ask God to give you visions of new ministries that defy the normal and let our new normal become celebration as God moves in powerful ways we have never seen before.

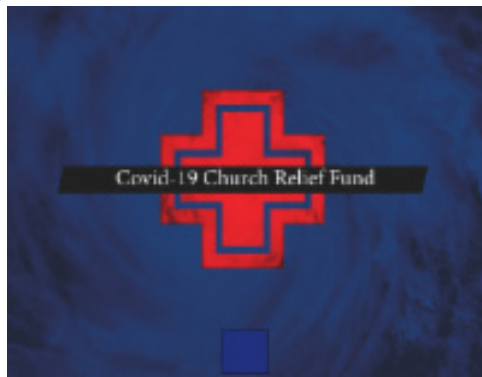
