Why do I give?

Have you noticed that one of the first words in a child's vocabulary is "mine?" I am dismayed as I watch my grandchildren playing together, and I hear that word constantly. It seems the power of possession compels us to acquire things and then selfishly hold them dear. Even as we grow older, the concept of sharing is a hard lesson to learn. Perhaps, the effort we put into gathering permits us to claim ownership and the need to protect what we have.

When do we learn the lesson that "it is better to give than to receive?" I remember the Christmas after I got my first full-time job. I had money to spend on great gifts for the family. I was so proud, but when I compared that to what I spent on myself over the next year, I was ashamed. That led me to learn the lesson of tithing. While I initially tithed my 10 percent to the church, my motivation was more out of discipline than desire. That took me on a journey of exploring the question, **why do I give?**

For those who have trusted in Jesus Christ as their Savior, that selfless gift of salvation is difficult to comprehend. God gave from an abundant heart of love that could do no less. If He gave to someone as worthless as I am, shouldn't I seek to emulate that spirit of giving? But, it doesn't come naturally! I realize the constant struggle in my heart is to be sensitive to the need of those around me.

Giving was foundational to the relationship that God had with the children of Israel. The system of sacrifices was not because God needed anything from them. It was designed as a gift to receive God's blessing and a reminder that He owns everything, and we are but His stewards. David acknowledged in 1 Chronicles 29:11 **"for everything in the heavens and on earth belongs to you!"** This same attitude of worship plays out over and over again in the early church. Acts 2:44-45 says, **"Now all believers were together and held all things in common. They sold their possessions and property and distributed the proceeds to all, as any had need."** Paul taught the early church to give generously in support of the ministry and even gathered a collection to take to the suffering church in Jerusalem.

Southern Baptists have developed the Cooperative Program as a way of supporting mission work around the world. The Lottie Moon Christmas Offering has been an effective tool in taking the gospel to untold millions in remote parts of the world. We give because He gave! We give to honor Him and worship Him! We give because of His compelling love.

At Christmas, we celebrate the greatest gift that was ever given: a baby in a manger who was the Son of God. Let's be faithful in sharing that gift with a lost world.

What if you were to say publicly that homosexuality is a sin? You would be targeted by an army of gender neutral bloggers and tweeters enough to make your head spin. This is the America we now live in. It seems it has turned on a dime. It is the fruit of years of carefully laid plans by evil navigators. Even though my wife says I am vulnerable, not just because of age, but due to the accident, I am blessed that through all this I have not been sick. Wearing masks, distancing and washing hands has been effective. Life can go on with the adjustments we have made and we shouldn’t fear. I “can-do” and not fear because of the strength I have in Christ. We all need one another. We all need to hear from one another.

Here is the question, can we proclaim to our world around us a “can-do” worldview that includes the gospel? Churches that have created a “Can-Do Evangelism Culture” see many coming to Christ in this crisis. People are more open now to talk about God. Our State Evangelism Conference, February 1-2, in the Anchorage area will focus on a “Can-Do Evangelism Culture.” Does your church have a culture? Yes it does. It is created and manifested through your church leaders. That includes pastors, Bible teachers and others. They project a culture. Is it evangelistic? Do you think we can do evangelism in the midst of everything that is going on? Yes. Let me say it again, YES! Christians know strength, courage, contentment, peace and hope through it all. The world is looking for what we have. Let’s share it. We have a great line up of mostly in-state pastors who will share their evangelistic hearts with you. We will also Zoom in some testimonies from pastors who have instilled an evangelism culture in their churches. I hope you will make plans to join us for this most important conference. November 9-10, 2020, Summary of Board Actions:

1. Approved to accept the committee breakdown recommended by President Hoffman. A copy of the committee breakdown is in the master file of the November 9-10, 2020, Executive Board Meeting.
2. Approved to accept the May 5, 2020, Alaska Baptist Resource Network Executive Board Meeting Minutes. A copy of the May 5, 2020, ABRN Executive Board Meeting Minutes is in the master file of the November 9-10, 2020, Executive Board Meeting.
3. Approved to accept the August 3, 2020, Alaska Baptist Resource Network Executive Board Meeting Notes. A copy of the August 3, 2020, ABRN Executive Board Meeting Notes is in the master file of the November 9-10, 2020, Executive Board Meeting.
4. Approved to accept the September 29-30, 2020, Alaska Baptist Resource Network 75th Annual Meeting Minutes. A copy of the September 29-30, 2020, Alaska Baptist Resource Network 75th Annual Meeting Minutes is in the master file of the November 9-10, 2020, Executive Board Meeting.
5. Approved to replace Policies and Procedures Manual Part III, Section XX Christmas Love Gift with the following, "The Executive Board of the Alaska Baptist Convention/Alaska Baptist Resource Network will allow a Christmas Love Gift of \$500 per each full time employee and \$250 per each permanent part time employee. The Christmas Love Gift will be reported as compensation according to IRS and State rules.
6. Approved to reword Policies and Procedures Manual II, Section VII. Financial. A copy of the rewording is in the master file of the November 9-10, 2020, Executive Board Meeting.
7. Approved to replace Policies and Procedures Manual Part 3, Article XVI, Section B. with the following: Staff Directors have the authority to spend up to \$2,500 of Staff Action Restricted Funds. Expenditures exceeding \$2,500 must have prior approval of the Executive Director/Treasurer of the Alaska Baptist Convention/Alaska Baptist Resource Network. Staff Action Restricted Fund Accounts are identified on the Chart of Accounts located in the Operation and Finance Administrator's office of the ABC/ABRN. Also approved creating Section C under Policies and Procedures Manual Part 3, Article XVI to read as follows: Any non-budgeted expenditure exceeding \$10,000 in total must have the prior approval of the Executive Board of the ABC/ABRN.
8. Approved the September 2020 Financial Reports. A copy of the September 2020 Financial Reports is in the master file of the November 9-10, 2020, Executive Board Meeting.
9. Approved the revision of the 2021 Budget of the Alaska Baptist Resource Network. A copy of the revised 2021 Budget of the ABRN is in the master file of the November 9-10, 2020, Executive Board Meeting.
10. Approved the housing allowance of Randy Covington, Jason D. McKee, and James Stewart. The amount of housing allowance requested is filed in the November 9-10, 2020, Executive Board Meeting master file folder.
11. Approved to invite a CPA or financial assessor in 2021 to assess the 2020 ABC/ABRN and Alaska Baptist Foundation financial records. The assessor's expenses will be charged to Account 5231 Accounting Consultant.
12. Approved \$15,000 from Account 8196 for Rural Ministry Travel Assistance this year.
13. Approved \$10,000 of the remaining monies of the Covid-19 relief funds goes to Laverne Griffin Youth Camp; \$10,000 to Orton Ranch, and \$10,000 to Camp Baldwin to help the setback they each took because of Covid-19.
14. Approved to set the special offerings goals for 2021 as follows: Annie Armstrong Easter Offering to \$75,000; Lottie Moon Christmas Offering to \$150,000; and Valeria Sherard State Mission Offering to \$75,000.
15. Approved Cross Country Church, Wasilla as 2nd quarter 2021, 2000 Club Call recipient. The funds will be used to drill a new well on the church property.
16. Approved Wasilla Korean Baptist Church as 3rd quarter 2021, 2000 Club Call recipient. The funds will be used to renovate an old house trailer to be used by the church.
17. Approved First Baptist Church, Palmer as 4th quarter 2021, 2000 Club Call recipient. The funds will be used to assist in completing the building of the Picnic Pavilion in the church's Friendship Park.
