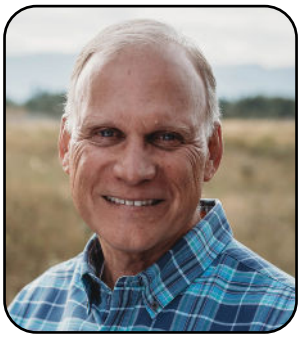

ADVANCING THE VISION

There have been many moments in my life when God has brought me to a mountaintop for the purpose of renewal and reflection. Hebrews 10:19-21 describes the moment for the author of this letter to reflect on the past with what I call the “since we...” statements. These statements of affirmation are followed by “Let us...” statements (vss 22-26). “Since we...” allows us to look back at what God has done for us, which then empowers us to say “Let us...” engage with hope and commitment our future. The two views from the mountaintop are essential to understanding the vision to which we have been called.

Our vision is to be a people who Abide in Christ, Build the Kingdom of Heaven on Earth, and Cooperate in One Sacred Effort. This vision was adopted in 2018 and has been our guiding focus through the leadership of the Holy Spirit for the past five years.

1. We Abide in Christ - “I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing. (John 15:5 NKJV) As branches, we must stay connected to the vine, growing, strengthening and producing the fruit that He wants to develop in us. This involves personal devotion to the study of God’s Word as well as corporate worship and instruction in how to walk daily abiding in His grace and His love.

2. We Build the Kingdom of Heaven on Earth - “And I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.” (Matthew 16:19 NKJV) There’s a great deal of power in keys. It’s not our talents or abilities that qualify us for the task of building His Kingdom. It is the keys that He places in our hands to open the door of salvation to those who are lost. We are the Church!

3. We Cooperate in One Sacred Effort - “that they all may be one, as You, Father, are in Me, and I in You; that they also may be one in Us, that the world may believe that You sent Me.” John 17:21 NKJV) We are the family of the redeemed. We become One with the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit for the purpose of reaching an unbelieving world. The Great Commission was given to all His children and His desire is that we work in tandem with one another to fulfill that calling.

This statement describes who we are (branches of the vine), what we do (build the kingdom), and how we do it (together in unity). It is imperative that we embrace the reality that only God can accomplish the task as He empowers us and gifts us individually for specific works through the Holy Spirit. It must be ever before us and behind us, guiding, directing and moti-

Southern Baptists encouraged to pray for global persecuted church

Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church, Sunday, Nov. 5

In a world where someone is killed for their faith every two minutes, Southern Baptists are uniting in prayer on Sunday, Nov. 5, for the Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church.

Resources are available now from the International Mission Board to raise awareness of global persecution and the church's role in praying for those suffering for their faith in Christ. The IMB is providing a range of downloadable resources to guide churches and individuals in focused prayer. These resources include a comprehensive prayer guide, bulletin inserts, social media graphics and promotional videos.

Startling statistics from Open Doors' World Watch List reveal last year alone, 5,621 Christians lost their lives due to faith-related reasons, 2,110 churches faced brutal attacks, and 4,542 Christians were unjustly detained. Shockingly, one in seven Christians worldwide currently faces persecution in various forms.

Each day, dedicated IMB missionaries stand alongside courageous national believers who endure unimaginable persecution for simply living out their faith. Recent events in Guerrero, Mexico, serve as a stark example of this ongoing struggle. Eduardo, a local believer, was arrested by authorities for renouncing his role as a lay priest/cantor, a position that the Catholic Church had compensated him for. His unjust detainment resulted in an exorbitant fine and imprisonment until the sum could be paid.

Eduardo's church family rallied to his support, approaching local authorities to secure his release from what they knew was an unjust incarceration. An IMB

missionary in the area recounted, "They assumed that they would be arrested, as well, for their actions so went prepared with blankets and their guitars. Today, one brother remains in jail, but the others were able to visit him, pray with him and encourage him."

The IMB team in Guerrero earnestly requests prayers for Eduardo and for other believers to remain strong in their faith, despite fear of persecution.

As the Day of Prayer approaches, Southern Baptists are encouraged to join in weeks of fervent prayer. Pray not only for the persecuted, but also for Christian workers worldwide who support their national partners amidst persecution.

Key areas of prayer include:

- Praying for the persecuted, that they may find the strength to live in the power, love and sound mind that only God can provide.
- Praying for those who have suffered brutalization, that they may sense the Lord's love surrounding them and respond to those who have injured them with grace and dignity.
- Praying for followers of Christ to consistently study and obey Scripture, so they are spiritually prepared when persecution inevitably comes.
- Praying for each church to maintain its focus on the glory of God and the growth of His church, even in the face of adversity.

Generous Lottie Moon offering helps missionaries tackle greatest problem

Generosity and gratitude. These words resonate with International Mission Board missionaries when they hear of how faithfully Southern Baptists continue to support them through the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering® and the Cooperative Program.

The current total of gifts to the 2022-23 Lottie Moon offering is \$196.1 million — besting the \$190 million goal.

“Thank you, Southern Baptists, for your growing commitment to get the gospel to the nations!” IMB President Paul Chitwood said.

These gifts empower IMB missionaries to tackle the greatest problem — lostness.

Trey Fleming serves with his family in Osaka, Japan. He said he recently shared the gospel with a woman who had never heard it before.

“That’s the greatest problem in the world today, lostness,” Fleming said. “We’re diving into that, trying our best to share the gospel with people who are all around us here in Osaka, Japan, who have just never heard the story before,” Fleming said.

He expressed his gratitude, saying, “Thank you so much for sending us and supporting us.”

Moses Mivedor serves with his family in Senegal, and this year, he taught a new church how to sing worship songs to God. In the past, the people sang to worship idols, and now they praise Jesus. The generous gifts to the LMCO make it possible for Mivedor to lead these believers in song.

Southern Baptists have not forgotten Ukrainians in their era of need. Pastor Vitaly Sorokun of the Baptist Union of Ukraine thanked Southern Baptists for their history of sending missionaries

to Ukraine and their ongoing support in the country’s great hour of need.

“I came to know Jesus Christ because of a Southern Baptist missionary. I began to

grow as a Christian because of a Southern Baptist missionary. And we have served with the missionaries from the IMB over all these years,” Sorokun said.

An IMB missionary ordained Sorokun, and he planted a church. When the war in Ukraine began, his wife walked across the border to Romania.

“The first people who met her on that other side were our dear friends from the IMB. They were able to welcome her, to give her a hug, to give her a hot cup of tea and to send her further,” Sorokun said. “Thank you for your support. Thank you for your generosity. Thank you for your prayers. And thank you for your presence with us around the world. God bless you abundantly.”

The \$190 million goal for 2022-23 was set in partnership with Woman’s Missionary Union. The \$196.1 million total includes gifts to specific projects, often referred to as Lottie Moon challenges or Lottie giving projects.

“We celebrate the generosity demonstrated by these incredible gifts to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering,” said Sandy Wisdom-Martin, the executive director-treasurer for Woman’s Missionary Union.

“Southern Baptists have no intention of abdicating their mandate of taking the gospel to the nations. We joyfully sacrifice at home and abroad to address the world’s greatest problem, lostness,” Wisdom-Martin continued.

One hundred percent of the money given to the offering and directly to the IMB goes to the work overseas to support missionaries and their mission initiatives. Because of faithful giving to the Cooperative Program, which pays for support staff in the U.S. as well as missionary support, every dollar of the LMCO goes toward gospel advancement overseas. Southern Baptists use these offerings together to carry out the work of the Great Commission.

“Your generosity also makes way for a growing missionary force amid the unprecedented growth of lostness,” Chitwood said. The IMB missionary applicant pipeline recently reached 1,300, which positions Southern Baptists well to grow the current number of missionaries overseas.

“As we begin a new fiscal year, we are praying that giving continues to grow and keeps pace with the growing number of missionaries who want to serve through the IMB.”

78TH ANNUAL MEETING OF THE ALASKA BAPTIST RESOURCE NETWORK

SUMMARY AND PHOTOS

Summary of the 2023 Annual Meeting Motions:

1. The Credentials Committee's recommendation to seat 151 registered messengers representing 40 Alaska Baptist churches to the 78th Annual Meeting of the Alaska Baptist Convention/Alaska Baptist Resource Network (ABC/ABRN) was approved. There were also 53 guests registered.
2. The 78th Annual Meeting program was adopted as printed. The program is filed in the master file of the 2023 Annual Meeting folder at the ABC/ABRN office.
3. The 2023 Convention Standing Rules were adopted. A copy of the Convention Standing Rules is filed in the master file of the 2023 Annual Meeting folder at the ABC/ABRN office.
4. The ABC/ABRN 2022 assessor's report located on pages 29-46 of the 2023 Book of Reports was approved. A copy of the 2023 Book of Reports is in the master file of the 2023 Annual Meeting folder at the ABC/ABRN office.
5. The motion to refer the amendment of the 2024 ABC/ABRN Budget to include a line item with designated funds of \$24,000 to advance the gospel to the native people of Alaska back to the Budget and Finance Committee and the Executive Board decide in their November 2023 meeting passed by a majority vote.
6. The Alaska Baptist Foundation 2022 assessor's report located on pages 49-60 of the 2023 Book of Reports was approved. A copy of the 2023 Book of Reports is in the master
7. The Annual Committee's recommendations located on page 77 of the 2023 Book of Reports were approved as amended: to replace Gary Moats to serve on the ABC/ABRN Executive Board from October 2023 to September 2024 with Paul Frost. A copy of the 2023 Book of Reports is in the master file of the 2023 Annual Meeting folder at the ABC/ABRN office.
8. The motion to have the Constitution and Bylaws Committee study adopting the Baptist Faith and Message 2000 as the official statement of faith for the ABC/ABRN and bring recommendations to the Convention at the 2024 annual meeting passed by a majority vote.
9. The motion to accept Foundation Church, Soldotna as an affiliated church of the ABC/ABRN passed without opposition.
10. The new ABC/ABRN officers were installed: Rob Scott, pastor of Dillingham Bible Church, to serve as President; Philip Coleman, pastor of True North Church-Anchorage, to serve as First Vice President; Nathaniel Buck, pastor of Agape Fellowship-Wasilla, to serve as Second Vice President; and Cathy Arns, member of First Baptist Church-Anchorage, to serve as Recording Secretary.
