#### **Big Lake Baptist Church**


Big Lake has voted to increase their missions giving in 2010.

#### The Trail of the Alaska Cooperative Missions Program

Suppose Bob and Sue are a typical Alaska Southern Baptist family. They have a monthly income of \$4,170.00. They are members of a typical Alaska Southern Baptist congregation with a membership of 100 persons. Serious about stewardship, each month they dedicate their tithe (10%) \$417.00, to the Lord's work through their local church and pray that God will bless it.

#### What happens to Bob and Sue's tithe of \$417.00?

Their church gives 10% (\$41.70) through the Cooperative Missions Program and sends it to the Alaska Baptist Convention, Anchorage, to be divided between Alaska and Southern Baptist mission causes.

Their church also gives 3% (\$12.51) to support the work of their local Baptist Association.

The balance of \$362.79 supports the work of their local church

What happens to the 10% (\$41.70) given through the Cooperative **Missions Program?** 

67% (\$27.94) is used for mission work in Alaska.

- Provides assistance to plant new congregations.
- Provides support to Campus Ministers, Church Planters, Mission Service Corps Missionaries, associational DOMs, a total of 15 fullyappointed NAMB missionaries and the ABC staff.
- Provides upkeep and insurances for the ABC office facilities.
- Provides training at the association and convention levels.
- Helps to tell the mission stories of the Alaska Baptist churches.

33% (\$13.76) is used for Cooperative Mission work beyond Alaska. (Sent by the Alaska Baptist Convention to the Southern Baptist Convention offices, Nashville, Tennessee)

\$6.88 helps support 5,562 International missionaries around the world. \$3.14 helps provide partial or full support for 5,611 missionaries serving in North America.

\$3.02 goes to theological education ministries with our six seminaries. \$0.23 helps fund Christian ethics and religious liberty ministries for the SBC.

**\$0.49** is used for general expenses of the Southern Baptist Convention.

#### The multiplying effect

Bob and Sue have a small but very important part in the very large Acts 1:8 and Matthew 28:18-20 enterprise conducted by Southern Baptists. The mission's part of their tithe is added to that of 15,000 other Alaska Southern Baptists and that of 16.2 million other Southern Baptists in all 50 states and territories. Altogether, that adds up to \$204,385,593 just for SBC causes, in addition to what is used for mission work in Alaska.

Bob and Sue are providing a way through the Cooperative Program that allows 100% of the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for International Missions, Annie Armstrong Easter Offering for North American Missions and Valeria Sherard Mission Offering for Alaska state missions to get to where they are intended. The Cooperative Program pays for all administrative costs.

Though LifeWay Christian Resources and the Woman Missionary Union do not receive Cooperative Program mission dollars directly, people whose salaries are paid with CP dollars are responsible for the promoting and implementing of the programs sponsored by these entities.

The Cooperative Program Trail allows every Southern Baptist church in Alaska to be a part of reaching Alaska, North America and the World with the Gospel. Many Alaska Baptist churches support mission work in addition to the Cooperative Mission Program. They are working to make Acts 1:8 and Matthew 28:18-20 a reality in their churches.

Thank you Alaska Baptists! For the many "Bobs and Sues" I pray you will remain faithful and others will understand that stewardship is not about money. It is a spiritual matter.

Have you ever noticed that sometimes things aren't actually as they appear? For example, as I am writing this, we are in the middle of the National Football League (NFL) playoffs (by the way, it is my hope that your team does not necessarily lose but that it does not score as many points as my team). When we say "football", we know what we are talking about...good, old-fashioned American football...pads, helmets, cleats, first downs, forward passes, field goals, huddles and more. However in Australia, their "football" is nothing like ours. They have Aussie League Football...no downs, no forward passes, no field goals, no huddles. In almost every other nation in the world their "football" is our soccer. The word is the same but there are three different definitions.

Recently, I was in a training session for a mission trip I am participating in this April and during the training, the facilitator asked how many continents there are. I was so proud of myself for knowing the answer -- seven: Europe, Africa, Australia, South American, North America, Asia and Antarctica. Then he told us that same answer in Spain would be incorrect! In Spain, they only recognize five continents: Europe, Africa, Asia, Australiaand The Americas. Antarctica is not a continent and North and South America are considered as one. Think of some of the words we use -- in the United States, a "bonnet" is a ladies frilly hat. In England, a bonnet is the hood of the car. In the United States, a "boot" is a piece of foot wear. In England, it is the trunk of the car -- same words, but different meanings.

During the month of February when we celebrate Valentine's Day, it is my hope you really come to understand and appreciate the love God has for you. It is also my hope you are willing to share the Good News of God's love to those with whom you come in contact.

I would like to conclude this article by quoting God's first "valentine", John 3:16, in a way that might be a little different from how you have heard it before: For God...who is the greatest lover...so loved...with the greatest degree... the world...which is the greatest company...that He gave...which is His greatest act...His only Son...which is His greatest gift...that whosoever will...our greatest opportunity... believe...with the greatest simplicity...on Him...the world's greatest attraction...shall not perish... God's greatest promise...but...the greatest difference... have everlasting life...our greatest possibility.

Blessings on you as you serve Him in your Community (Jerusalem), State (Judea), Nation (Samaria) or anywhere you may be in the world (Uttermost parts of the Earth)!

What does "intentional evangelism" mean to you? Does your congregation think about being intentional in their evangelism? Here is a question to consider -- who in our church is responsible for evangelism? We have Sunday School/Bible Study directors, discipleship leaders, AWANA directors, worship leaders, but who is actually responsible for evangelism? Pastor, if you say that responsibility is yours, what is your plan for evangelism? If the plan is primarily to get the lost to come to your church and hear you preach, I have two questions: how many lost people come to hear you preach and, how many times do you preach an evangelistic message? An evangelistic message should not be a "blip" at the end of the sermon before an invitation.

Actually, it is not the responsibility of the pastor to be the chief, or only, evangelist, but the imperative is that all believers share the Gospel. How are you training and encouraging your people to be involved in this discipleship component? I contend that we really are not "disciples" if we are not making disciples. This tough statement did not originate with me but lands squarely on my shoulders as I examine myself. Is the goal of our churches to bring people to worship services to hear our messages or to help them discover God and what He wants for them? If the latter is the goal, then all believers can and should be involved in this process. The pastor cannot do it all. I believe we may need to change some things in our churches and emphasize discipleship more than attendance and baptism. What if we measured success by the number of people in our church being discipled by an equipped disciple-maker rather by than the number of baptisms? What if everyone who was baptized did so with the expectation of receiving an intensive period of teaching in the Christian foundations of our faith and denomination? Would that change how people respond to Christ?


