The M Factor

he Millennials are America's newest generation, 76 million strong and ranging in age from 10-30. Who are they and what makes them tick?

- They are the most ethnically and racially diverse cohort of youth in the nation's history. Among those ages 13 to 29: 18.5% are Hispanic; 14.2% are black; 4.3% are Asian; 3.2% are mixed race or other; and 59.8%, a record low, are white.
- They are the least religiously observant generation since survey research began charting religious behavior. One-in-four are unaffiliated with any religion.
- Millennials are the first "always connected" generation. 90% are connected to the Internet. Nearly three in four of those who go online use social networking sites. One-in-five have posted a video of themselves online.
- Millennials are on track to become the most educated generation in American history.
- More than three quarters of young adults (76%) agree there are absolute standards of right and wrong. More than half of young adults (55%) say that houses of worship should speak out on social and political matters.

With the approval of the recommendations from the Great Commission Resurgence (GCR) task force at the June 2010 annual meeting of the Southern Baptist Convention, it is still unclear how the ABC will be impacted. The main message I hear is "change is coming." The ABC staff is discussing our leadership vision and strategy and I have asked them to provide the top five priorities in their respective ministry areas. During February, March and April, the ABC staff will visit each association, meeting with Associational Directors of Missions, pastors and members listening to their strategy and vision to reach their communities, and determining how we can partner more effectively.

During the next five to seven years, the GCR strategies will be phased in across the nation. I ask that you pray for me every day, and as the Lord brings me to mind. We are praying for you and are ready to serve and partner with you in every we can. Our desire is to assist you to be the persons and congregations that God has called you to be, as we are "Alaskans Reaching Alaska."

Christmas was an incredible season and I had so many opportunities to share Christ with others. I know great things happened in our churches as a result of the ministries and events planned around the Christmas holiday. I hope you will take time to tell me about those results. I am excited about the upcoming State Evangelism Conference (SEC) and the wonderful line-up of special guests: Tommy and Rita Teague (North Richland Hills Baptist Church, Texas), Wayne Shuffield (Baptist General Convention of Texas), Bruce Raley (Lifeway Christian Resources), Jerry Pipes (Jerry Pipes Productions), Jack Lawlor (Real Life Ministries) and Roger Byrd (California southern Baptist Convention). There is so much they will share with us during the SEC and I know your "cup" will be filled. In fact, I hope that you will bring extra "cups" with you. I encourage you to bring your music leaders and those responsible for evangelism, Bible study and vision planning in your church. I know they will all be challenged as we seek God's face in reaching Alaska for Christ. The more messages they hear and breakouts they attend the better. I pray God will renew in us a vision and passion for reaching Alaska.

What is your church dreaming and planning for this new year? How will you reach out to those around you? How will you help others grow to be followers and disciples of Christ? About 55 pastors requested the book "Transformational Church" and I hope you will read your copy before the SEC. The theme for our conference is "Transformation" -- transformation that needs to take place in my life, in my home, in my witness, in my walk, in my church and in our state. Transformation will result in a new "scorecard" for our churches. Simply counting "noses and nickels" doesn't reflect what God is doing and wants to do in our churches. Transformation will discern the needs around us, embrace the walk and character of Christ and engage in the mission to which He has called us. Have you thought about how you might change the way you disciple those who attend your church which will result in a more measurable outcome? Has your church set new goals to challenge your people to be more "radical" in their faith and the way they share that faith with others? Many of the churches in our convention participated in taking the Gospel to homes around their churches this past year. That may have been very radical for some people. What will you do this year? For those of us in the Anchorage area, I want to challenge believers to begin something new outside of their church building -- an English as a Second Language (ESL) class in a housing complex, a Bible study in an apartment, a theology discussion in a coffee house or a seeker group for individuals who want to ask the hard questions of Christians. Have you thought about doing a specific evangelism training event for your members, or a special Bible study training for your leaders? We offer some great conferences for churches wanting help in the area of apologetics and dealing with cults. Last year was an exciting year of ministry and I believe this year will be even more exciting. I pray we will see God bless our ministries and our churches as they seek to be transformational in everything they do.

We're preoccupied with the future. It's amazing how people do all kinds of different things to forecast the future: palmreading, astrology, reading tea leaves and fortune cookies - different ways to get a grasp on the future. We read books, subscribe to seminars that forecast the economic predictions and we attend conferences and seminars on planning and goal setting. What is the Christian viewpoint toward the future?

Here's what James says in the fourth chapter. "Now listen, you who say, 'Today or tomorrow we will go to this or that city, spend a year there, carry on business and make money.' Why, you do not even know what will happen tomorrow. What is your life? You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes. Instead, you ought to say, 'If it is the Lord's will, we will live and do this or that.' As it is, you boast in your arrogant schemes. All such boasting is evil. If anyone, then, knows the good they ought to do and doesn't do it, it is sin for them."

The starting point in facing the future is to ask, "God, what do you want me to do and not to do?" Planning without prayer is presumptuous. He says we should preface all of our planning with the phrase, "if the Lord wills". You could trivialize it, however, James is saying that the whole attitude of our life should be whatever God wants us to do is what we want

Just because the future is uncertain, unsure and brief, that doesn't mean you need to get uptight and paralyzed with panic and worry. Instead, it should be the motivation to trust God more. Put your trust in God to face the future. Don't make the mistake of presuming about tomorrow include God in your planning and make the most of today.

There are three things you can do with your life: spend it, waste it, or invest it. The best use of life is to invest it in something that is going to last. What's going to last forever? God's Word and people will last forever. People will last one of two places for eternity. Invest your life in things that will last -- the word of God and people. Make it count.

The greatest mistake in life is to forget God - to leave Him out of your life. We can go to church on Sunday, talk about the Lord, and never consult Him, or have any reference, much less, preference for Him in our business, our families, our marriage, or our schoolwork. In facing the future we need to pray, "Lord help me to plan according to Your will. Lord, help me to live one day at a time. Lord, help me to do what I know is right to do."

The Bible says, "God will take care of your tomorrow too." We don't know what the future holds but we do know who holds the future.
