

The first day of a New Year elicits different reactions: relief that the old year is over; an uncertainty as to what lies ahead; a fear of coming change; an anticipation of what the New Year might bring. As our Convention marks the first full year of transition and change as a result of the Great Commission Resurgency and reorganization at the North American Mission Board, we look forward to more change. Some of the changes in 2012 are:

- Our Cooperative Program (CP) budget has been reduced by \$317,638.
- Our jointly-appointed ABC and NAMB missionary personnel have been reduced from 15 to 7. In the process, we have said "goodbye and thank you for a job well done" to Don Shannon, Mike Purple, Brenda Crim, Linda Hokit and Paul Wells, as well as being unable to fill three vacant positions.
- Butch Strickland, formerly our Contextualized Church Starter Strategist (Multi-Ethnic) is now serving as the Director of Church Planting and Missions.
- We have been challenged to adjust the division of our CP mission support. Currently, we are giving "67/33," which means when your congregation sends CP funds to the ABC, 67% remains in Alaska to be used as determined by our mission and ministry priorities, and 33% is sent to the Executive Committee of the Southern Baptist Convention to be used for mission needs across North America and internationally. We have been challenged to increase our CP giving to "50/50."
- We are being asked to reduce the mission and church planting support we receive from NAMB from "88/12" to "80/20"; currently for every \$12 we give to CP, we receive \$88 in return. The challenge is to increase our CP so that for every \$20 we give to CP, we will receive \$80 from NAMB.

These major impacts on our mission and ministry budget will be phased in over a multi-year timeframe.

In order to assist with these and upcoming changes, I have tasked the ABC Executive Board to study our current associational structure to determine if it is best in light of impending changes. With the retirement of Paul Wells, NAMB has indicated we will be unable to fill the Church Planter Catalyst position in the Tanana Valley Baptist Association with a jointly-appointed missionary because the association does not have the minimum population for such a position. I have also tasked the Executive Board with the definition of church affiliation and the process by which a church becomes affiliated with the ABC. Also, how should we prioritize our mission and ministry budget? Please pray for those who serve on the Executive Board and its committees, as they have a colossal task in front of them.

I am not wringing my hands nor am I fearful. I am confident the Lord will continue to meet our every need, as we walk in faith and obedience with Him. Rather, I am facing 2012 with a sense of excitement and anticipation as we witness God working mightily in our midst, as Alaskans are reached with the gospel of Jesus Christ, as believers grow in the grace and knowledge of God's Word, as congregations are strengthened and as new ministries and congregations are begun.

I was one in a group of five cousins, between the ages of 5 and 9, who determined our standard of manhood was whether or not we could jump off the back of our grandmother's chicken house. My memories of the experience were that the chicken house stood so high it precluded anyone from doing something so dangerous. Not only was Granny's chicken house not as tall as it used to be but that pedestal where I had placed missionaries didn't even exist.

I again find myself in a position where my ideas somehow don't agree with the reality of the situation. You have given me the responsibility of being the Director of Church Planting and Missions for the Alaska Baptist Convention. I never dreamed I would be serving in such a capacity and I want to thank you for the confidence you have placed in me. I pray I will be worthy of that confidence. As I begin the new year wearing a new "hat", please let me know if there is any way I can be of service to you.

We are also entering an era of new leadership in the North American Mission Board (NAMB). That means we will be developing new strategies that will not only keep us in line with NAMB's policies but will also help us do whatever it takes to win Alaska for Christ. Our executive director has challenged us to Seek Christ, Share Christ, Strengthen Congregations, Start Congregations and Send Christians.

As we move into 2012, there are steps we can take to make sure every village, ethnic group, and neighborhood has an opportunity to hear and respond to the gospel of Christ.
