

Since its inception in 1845, the Southern Baptist Convention (SBC) has always had one mission—the Great Commission (Matt 28:19-21).

Article 2 of the SBC Constitution states: "It is the purpose of the Convention to provide a general organization for Baptists in the United States and its territories for the promotion of Christian missions at home and abroad and any other objects such as Christian education, benevolent enterprises, and social services which it may deem advisable for the furtherance of the Kingdom of God."

In the early years, the various entities of our Convention struggled to fulfill their assigned part of the divine mandate. During the years 1919-1925, a God-given partnership of missions support was conceived—the Cooperative Program (CP), one of the greatest miracles/ blessings of our history! Alaska Baptists began contributing to and participating in CP ministry in 1954 (\$4,623.87) and as we have grown over the last 58 years, we have contributed \$19,552,951!

I support the Cooperative Program because it gives me, a small church pastor in a small pioneer convention, a BIG opportunity to participate with 16 plus million Southern Baptists in over 45,000 churches across the United States to seek to accomplish the Great Commission of our Lord.

Across North America, May 20-27 is the week we highlight the ministry partner we know as the local association.

Simply put, the local association is comprised of congregations situated in close proximity geographically that choose to partner together to reach their community for Jesus Christ, assist with the strengthening of the local congregations, and strategize the planting of new congregations. Often someone will say, "We work together in order to do for the Lord that which we are unable to do by ourselves." As we know, every congregation is autonomous and "independent" from any ecclesiastical control, however that does not lessen our "interdependency" upon each other and the local association is the entity closest to the local congregation.

With the re-focus of the North American Mission Board, the emphasis of the Associational Director of Missions (ADOM) changed, increasing responsibility to facilitate church planting. The position title changed from ADOM to Church Planter Catalyst (CPC). The CPCs are still available to serve as a resource to the local congregation, and also tasked with facilitating the planting of four new congregations a year. This is a major ministry shift for them, as well as each association. In Alaska, we have four associations:

**Chugach Baptist Association (CBA)** is housed in Anchorage and supports congregations in the greater Anchorage/Eagle River area, Kenai Peninsula, Northwest Arctic and the Aleutian Islands chain. Dr. David George is the CBA CPC.



Hatcher Pass Baptist Association (HPBA) is



housed in the Palmer/Wasilla area and supports congregations in the

Mat-Su Valley, Valdez and Bristol Bay areas. Rev. Gary Bearce is the HPBA CPC.

**Tanana Valley Baptist Association (TVBA)** is housed in Fairbanks and supports congregations in Fairbanks, North Pole, Salcha, Delta Junction, Healy and Bristol. Currently, there is no CPC for this association.

Tongass Baptist Association (TBA) is housed in Ketchikan and supports congregations throughout the panhandle of Southeast Alaska. Rev. Joe Boney is TBA CPC. In addition, Rev. Alan Dial is our Alaska Native CPC tasked with facilitating new congre-

Are you ready for a celebration? In 2010, our churches reported 567 baptisms! In the last few years, we have experienced a decrease in baptisms in our Convention; in YEAR? we went from 600 to 400 baptisms but then had a surge to 513 baptisms. Because of that significant increase, the North American Mission Board recognized our Convention as having the largest percentage increase in baptisms nationally. This is cause for celebration and I am excited about it! On the flip side, we have another trend that is of concern—we have about 20 congregations without pastors and that will certainly affect our ministry and evangelistic efforts throughout the state this next year. But for now, let's celebrate and allow God to work through us.

One of the benefits of an increase in baptisms is in our relationship with Lifeway Christian Resources. They are very invested in state conventions and contribute to our state budget by assisting us to conduct Sunday school and VBS training clinics throughout the state. They also award bonus money for reaching goals in the state. When people say it should not be about numbers, that is true, but when churches report their numbers, which represent souls, and increases are evident, we see immediate rewards. Praise the Lord we have a Convention that seeks to help our churches do their work.

What evangelistic programs are you planning this year? The "God's Plan for Sharing" (GPS) emphasis of 2012 is evangelistic events and actions for our churches. Do you have anything planned? One church has requested funds to help with an evangelistic concert to be held this summer; another is doing a city-wide revival; still another has a city-wide block party planned. All of these events will result in the gospel being shared and people being led to Christ. Then, each person who receives Christ will have someone to disciple them. I want to help you and have funds available to assist with an evangelistic event. I am already planning an evangelistic event for women in September. If you would like training in evangelism, strategy development and organization for your church, please call me for assistance. I would love to see and hear your evangelistic plans for this year. If we plan for nothing, we will get exactly what we plan for. If we make some plans and execute them under the Spirit's power, I believe we will have another great year of evangelism resulting in baptisms.
