I have no idea how much it costs to keep ten thousand international and national missionaries on the field; or to certify chaplains for service with our military, hospitals, prisons and industry; or to subsidize Christian universities and seminaries ensuring they are accredited and staffed with the best professors. I have no idea what it takes other than sacrificial giving by men and women in the pews of every Southern Baptist church in America. My family and I have been the beneficiaries of Cooperative Program (CP) giving while living and serving in Lesotho in southern Africa, from the 4X4 truck we drove to the villages every day, to the small house with the tin roof that made sleeping so nice during the rain. The CP paid for health check-ups for our sons and for my cataract surgery; it bought Bibles to share with the Basotho People. Now, in Alaska, the CP keeps me on the road to the villages and as chaplain at the Alaska Native Health Center. It helps fund leadership programs for our native believers and the material needed to witness to those who do not yet know the Savior. Your church's participation in the CP is the natural extension of your association with the other 16,999,999 Southern Baptists and their 40,000 churches, all coming together to efficiently fund the varied needs for the completion of our Great Commission. I am the Cooperative Program...you are too!

EXCITING NEWS FROM HOONAH!

On June 30, First Baptist Church (FBC), Sitka launched a new church campus in Hoonah. The Hoonah campus meets on Sunday (via the internet) with the congregation of FBC. Bill and Ruth Brown, who came to Hoonah in September 2005 to start a drug and alcohol rehabilitation program, started a mission in Hoonah under the sponsorship of Emmanuel Baptist Church in Juneau. The mission closed its doors but reopened as a campus of FBC. The Browns continue their efforts to establish a drug and alcohol rehabilitation program in Hoonah as a separate endeavor from the Hoonah campus of FBC.

The campus church functions differently from a mission church. The goal and purpose of a mission is to become a self-supporting church. The campus church is simply an extension of an alreadyestablished church. The goal of FBC is to impact Hoonah with the gospel and win and disciple souls for Christ. The Browns have become a key to this process; they have opened their home so others can connect during church services. Hoonah will also participate in the electronic mentoring ministry FBC has established over the last year.

FBC hopes to connect with other preaching points in the region as well. A preaching point is a place unlikely or unable to establish a church. Since starting the campus church in Hoonah, a couple from Gustavus has expressed interest in starting a campus church in their community as well.

As of July 11, there were 15 pastorless congregations across the Alaska Baptist Convention. Some of these congregations have been pastorless for months, or even years.

I have talked with several pastors in the last few months who have mentioned they need more Sunday school, Bible study and small group leaders within their congregations, and others willing to be involved with the myriad ministries and activities of their congregations. This applies to large and small congregations alike.

The Alaska Baptist Convention constantly has vacancies on its boards and committees. Our Associational Church Planter Catalysts-Directors of Missions have indicated they are always searching for persons willing to participate in and lead events and activities around the state.

What do we do?

Obviously, we should encourage those within our congregations and ministries to seek the leadership of the Lord as to their place of service, challenging them to use their gifts, skills and talents. We should be equipping and training those in our congregations and ministries, empowering them to do what God has called them to do. One other often-overlooked strategy is found in Matthew 9:38. Jesus encourages us to pray to the Lord of the harvest to send forth laborers. How often do we pray for laborers? I would guess that, unless there is a pressing need, most of us seldom pray for workers, because we see that as the responsibility of the nominating committee or whoever has been tasked within the congregation or ministry to do so. I would like to propose it is a privilege for all of us to pray for laborers. The staff of the Alaska Baptist Convention has their cell phone alarms set to ring twice daily -- 9:38 a.m. and 9:38 p.m. The alarms remind us "...to pray unto the Lord of the harvest..." I encourage you to join us and set your phone or watch alarm to ring at 9:38 and pray the Lord will call out workers and that those He is calling will be faithful to answer His call.


