



Background check "helps keep kids safe"

Nashville (BP)—The man serving snow cones at your Vacation Bible School is a convicted sex offender.

That was the news Bill Jones had to deliver to one of the pastors in his association.

The pastor came to Jones after learning a volunteer, who had been a "model church member" for two years, may have had a criminal record.

"(The pastor) asked if I would do a background search, as I often do for our smaller churches that cannot afford it themselves," said Jones, executive director of Neches River Baptist Association in Crockett, TX.

The report did uncover a sex offense conviction, so the pastor and one of his deacons dealt with the volunteer.

Tom Belew, California Southern Baptist Convention childhood specialist, noted that background checks are "an important part of providing a safe and secure place for kids. Effective worker screening for volun-

teers and staff include an application, a background check, reference checks and an interview prior to placement in a ministry."

"A person should be a member of the church for six months before being placed in a ministry position," Belew added.

The Texas church was one of nearly 5,000 congregations and religious organizations that have

used www.backgroundchecks.com over the

past five years, through a relationship with LifeWay Christian Resources. There have been more than 84,500 background checks run through the <u>www.LifeWay.com/</u> backgroundchecks program during that time.

Of those checks, 53 percent (44,946) returned some type of issue, according to Jennie Taylor, a LifeWay coordinator who manages the bacgroundchecks.com program. The issues range from minor traffic violations to felony convictions., Taylor said. Not all of the issues required any action, but more than 22.5 percent (19,202) of the screenings returned records with misdemeanor or felony offenses.

Jones said the Texas church now understands the importance of running background checks ahead of time.

"They now have a policy that everyone who works in

(children and youth) areas will have a current background check on file," Jones said.

Belew noted that in addition to worker screening, "churches need to provide adequate worker supervision. Good supervision includes two adults in every class or activity, windows in each classroom door to enable supervisors to monitor activities, greeters to assist guests and prevent unwanted intrusions in the classroom area, all approved children's activities placed on the church calendar and an incident reporting process."

Monongahela Baptist Association in West Virginia also uses the LifeWay service to run background checks on all volunteers for their children and youth camps.

"It's a way to help keep kids safe," said Jerilyn Smith, administrative assistant at the association.

"We want to assure parents that we are doing all we can do to protect their children from those who would want to harm them," she added.

Under the LifeWay program, churches and religious organizations can use the background check

service at discounted rates. It is used to run background screenings on children's ministry workers, camp counselors, bus drivers or other volunteers and staff.

"Leaders from churches and organizations who use LifeWay's background checks service say protecting those god has placed under their


care is paramount," Taylor said.

She added backgroundchecks.com has "an extensive collection of public record sources," including more than 450 million records in its database. It also provides easy-to-read reports, she said.

"All churches...should have policies in effect on how those checks can be used in a redemptive manner for those that come back with a criminal past," Bill Jones added.

Four Steps to Encourage a Church Planter

It can be lonely out there. When a new church is begun, its pastor may sometimes feel isolated, especially during the initial months.

Planting new churches in North America is a high priority of Southern Baptists. As a member of a Southern Baptist church, you're already involved in church planting! Your church's contributions through the Cooperative Program and Annie Armstrong Easter Offering® help support hundreds of new church plants every year.

Would you go a step further, and personally encourage one church planter? Here are a few tips:

FIND ONE. Intentionally befriend a church planter and his family, whether he lives across town or across the country. If your church sponsors a plant, encourage that planter. Otherwise, ask your pastor to recommend one or search the online church plant map at <u>www.namb.net/churchplants</u> or meet planters at your local Baptist association or state convention.

BE AN ENCOURAGER. Give relational and prayer support. Study their newsletter, blog or website. Send email encouragements. Ask how things are going and how you can pray. Take him to lunch. Listen well. Praise God for blessings. Pray weekly at a specific time, i.e. Mondays at 9 p.m. send a note to remind him you're praying. Your small encouragements make a huge difference.


SHARE YOUR RESOURCES. Share monetarily. Your tithe is given to your local church, but God may prompt you to give additional weekly or monthly offerings to the church plant, such as \$20 or \$200. Contribute a one-time offering for a specific need, like a coffee pot, a down payment for land, Bibles, sound equipment or furniture. Organize a garage sale to fund a church sign. Bless the pastor with bookstore gift cards or a scholarship to attend a conference, convention or seminary class.

SHARE YOURSELF. Visit their worship service, constitution or groundbreaking event. Organize a mission trip for a building project, survey or event. Offer your skills and contacts. Can you teach, clean, organize or paint? Design a website, build a wall, play guitar, make outreach visits?

A new church needs a quality core group. If God leads, would you relocate to the church plant area to help for a few years or months? If God calls you, He'll provide a way.


As your church and denomination send new planters, will you personally encourage just one of them?

When Adolf Hitler rose to power in Germany, he was determined to take over the church and dictate the nation's religion. He falsely accused many clergy of being unpatriotic and traitors because they did not agree with him. Religious publications were suspended, couples were encouraged to be married in non-religious ceremonies and in 1935, Hitler outlawed prayer in schools. He did all he could to replace the Bible with Nazi propaganda.

Hitler had a more difficult time replacing traditional holidays, so he secularized them and changed their meaning; Easter became a celebration to mark the beginning of Spring (what do we now call what used to be "Easter" vacation? – "Spring break"); Christmas was renamed "Yuletide" and its celebration as a religious holiday was banned in schools in 1938. Holy days became holidays and the sacred became secularized.

We see the same thing happening in America today: social libertarians, along with the media and court system, seem determined to drain Christmas of its religious significance and make it a purely secular, pagan holiday. Go into nearly any store across America and what do you see as symbols of Christmas? – Santa Claus, snowmen, reindeer and elves. Store clerks wish you a "happy holiday"; and schools have "holiday" programs rather than Christmas programs. For many people, to wish someone "Merry Christmas" is interpreted as intolerance and religious bigotry. After all, aren't we supposed to be "all inclusive"?

Another Christmas season is upon us, so let's do whatever we can to remind our society that there cannot be **Christ**mas without **Christ**. We need to stay focused on Him during the season; proclaim His birth, life, death and resurrection; worship Him; and follow the example of the shepherds "...When they had seen Him, they made widely known the saying which was told them concerning this Child..." (Luke 2:17)

This year, when someone says "happy holidays" to me, I am going to respond with "Merry Christmas." I want them to think, if only for a moment, about the real reason for the season.

Merry **Christ**mas and may the Lord bless you exceedingly and abundantly!


