

Training Teens Today (T3)

Training Teens Today (T3) started in 2004 as an intentional leadership event for youth. Through this training over the past ten years, youth have served as leaders in their churches; helped with the youth ministry; formed youth councils to help facilitate a youth program; and started high school or middle school clubs to minister to kids at their school. Many have been trained in audio/technical ministry and assist in doing this in their church; some are involved with their church worship and praise team on Sunday mornings. It is exciting to see young people step up and take on ministry roles in the local church. We must never underestimate what young people are willing and able to

One of the T3 goals is to teach leadership. Students receive practical opportunities to learn and demonstrate leadership skills during an intensive week of ministry, and students are able to put into action everything they have learned. Along with elective tracks, students learn basic Bible doctrine. They also learn leadership skills, teamwork, decision making, and prayer ministry. All the students are involved in evangelistic ministries and service.



out evangelism initiatives, but nothing with the national prominence or staying power of the programs described above. Don't blame these agencies, however, for supposed shortcomings in their efforts. Offering these opportunities cannot overcome the apathy in many churches to adopt this kind of disciplined personal evangelism training.

So, what can be done? As a church leader, recognize people need training to effectively share their faith. They need information, but more importantly, increased confidence that comes from on-the-job training offered in a good training program. Choose an evangelism training program appropriate for your setting. Make a commitment to routinely include this training as part of your church's discipleship strategy. Stick with it for three years, then reevaluate. Expect to start small and build slowly. Don't worry about record numbers of participants. Allow God to enlarge the effort through the testimony of those who participate. Allow the results, people coming to faith in Jesus and presenting themselves for baptism, to provide the motivation to attract future participants.

Rediscovering evangelism training – routine, systemic, and systematic – is an important step to reversing the decline in our effectiveness in reaching new people with the gospel."

I tend to be fairly conservative when trying new things. Recently, Rebecca purchased a new style of sock for me to wear when I walk and work out. You know what I'm talking about – when I put them on, they barely reach the top of my ankle. Supposedly, everyone wears them to exercise, however I have my doubts. Up until now, I have worn socks that go halfway up my calf - "man socks"! Not "girlie socks"! But Rebecca bought them so I am wearing them. Once I put them on, as long as I don't look down, I don't notice any difference. Things are constantly changing and life is fluid. Just when I think I have something figured out, the "new and improved" version comes along and I am faced with a new challenge or learning experience.

In our spiritual lives, we should be open to all the new experiences the Lord has in mind for us. We do not want to become so set in our ways that we refuse to be flexible in following the Lord. You have heard people describe a person or congregation as being "in a rut" and a rut being "a grave with both ends kicked out." When applied to a congregation, it usually means one that has plateaued and is seldom willing to try anything new. I once read this statement, "we do not want to be experts in what used to work." We want to stay open to all the new ways the Lord may be leading us.

Back to my socks...the children of my generation put socks on the fireplace mantle at Christmas. What type of socks did we put up? Not "girlie" anklets or even mid-calf socks, but the largest, extra-long sock we could find – the one that would hold all the goodies and treats. In our walk with the Lord, let's be so open to His will that we experience all the blessings He provides.

From Jeff Iorg, President, Golden Gate Baptist Theological Seminary:

"Southern Baptists have never had more money, more trained leaders, more materials and programs, more technology, more of a national presence, and more of an international reach. Yet, despite all this, we are becoming less and less effective at communicating the gospel and baptizing people – the first public step of discipleship. In 2012, we baptized fewer people than any year since 1948. Why?

The reasons are many and varied. Over this summer, I am blogging about some of the reasons – making no attempt to write a comprehensive treatise, just sharing some perspectives from my vantage point.

What happened to personal evangelism training by churches? In the first twenty years of my ministry – corresponding to the last twenty years of the last century – personal evangelism training was a normal part of healthy church programming. There were many options available – like Evangelism Explosion, Continuing Witness Training, Lay Evangelism School, and others with more niche audiences. There were also less formal approaches like using the Roman Road or a booklet like Steps to Peace with God or The Four Spiritual Laws. In the past decade, these type of training programs have become rare.

This kind of training was not a "one and done" effort. It was systematic – meaning it was a normal part of church life, made available once or twice each year and repeated year after year so members could participate when convicted of the need for the training. Churches chose the approach that best fit their situation or context and, through this training, continually motivated their members to fulfill their personal responsibility to share the gospel.

These days, it's hard to find a church that has this kind of disciplined approach to training its membership to share the gospel. Our denomination has struggled in recent years to produce a national program to assist with this effort. LifeWay promoted FAITH for a few years, and some churches are still using that program. The North American Mission Board has rolled

Happy Mother's Day! I pray your Mother's Day will be unforgettable for all the right reasons. I also pray you will feel loved and appreciated. Those of us who have had the privilege of being raised by Christian mothers owe it to them to make it so.

My mother taught me to love Jesus. She corrected me when I was wrong. She encouraged me when I was right. She did so many things I took for granted—cooked my meals, washed my clothes, even made some of them. I'll never forget that white leisure suit! When God called me to the mission field, she said, "Venezuela is a long way from home." My response was in jest, but she understood perfectly, "It's all your fault," I said. "You took us to the mission you helped establish. You made us go to Royal Ambassadors (RA) and Girls' Auxiliary (GA). We went to RA and GA camp every summer. We were in church every Sunday, even when missionaries came. We were in discipleship classes every Sunday evening and Sunday School every Sunday morning. With that much exposure to the work of Jesus, the call came naturally."

Mom—this illustration is for you:

"A pastor had preached a strong sermon on personal evangelism pointing out every Christian's obligation to reach out and win others to the Lord. The sermon needed to be preached, of course, as it still does. Only apparently he had been guilty of some unfair emphases. The husband of this Christian mother was completing his resident work as a medical doctor but still found time to spend working at church. The wife beautifully cared for their three lovely children. All of them were very young and required a lot of time. During the meal the wife asked the pastor if he remembered the scripture, "For as his share is who goes down into battle, so shall his share be who stays by the baggage" (1 Sam 30:24). He confessed his ignorance, and she gave the context of King David insisting that the home guard be rewarded equally with those who had the more obviously essential role of fighting in the front line. Then she shared a wonderful truth which is so easily forgotten. She mentioned that she felt that taking care of children, patiently teaching them the ways of God, looking for moments to correct them from wrong decisions was "staying with the baggage." She went on to point out that she often felt guilty for not doing more of the "church" work than she did. But she felt her greatest ministry was being a dedicated Christian mother." 


