As a spiritual discipline for the last few years, I have given up something for the year. Two years ago, I gave up coffee; this past year, I gave up desserts and sweets. I do this as a way to discipline myself. Whenever I am tempted by a dessert, I say a quick prayer of thanksgiving that life is more than what I eat and I do not "live by bread alone."

This past year, I unintentionally blew it three times: after a restaurant meal, when the waitress gave me an after-dinner mint, I popped it into my mouth; while enjoying the free samples at Costco, I walked by one of the carts and ate the ice cream sandwich sample; and finally, I was feeding a Dairy Queen Blizzard to my grandson Owen, and we were playing the "open up the hangar, here comes the plane" game when I buzzed the plane by his "hangar" and right into mine. After each incident, I immediately realized what I had done and chastised myself for not paying attention.

As I reflect back on my commitment for 2014, I am reminded of the truth that we become children of God and are saved and have our sins forgiven, not because we are able to keep a moral law or through an effort of our own will or by following the Ten Commandments or by trying hard enough. We become children of God because we have received Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior. No matter how hard we try, we all fall short...sometimes it is unintentional and sometimes it is with forethought and deliberation, but none of us can earn our salvation or a relationship with the Father through our good works. The only way we can become children of God and receive the gift of forgiveness of sins is by trusting Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior. As the Apostle Paul said in Romans 7:24-25, "...who can set me free from my old sinful self? I thank God I can be free through Jesus Christ our Lord". (New Life Version)

In 2015, I have made a commitment to give up one of my all time favorite foods – chips in any form. As in 2014, I do this, not to gain favor with the Lord, because I am already one of His beloved, but to have control over my body and, when I am weak and ready to yield to temptation, to pray and ask the Lord to give me strength.

Have you ever experienced a spiritual awakening either personally or as member of a group? In the past, America has seen moments of deep spiritual resolve and God's presence has been greatly manifested in the lives of believers. But nationally, we have not seen a transforming movement of God in many years. People talk about the "Jesus movement" which may be closest thing to a pouring out of God's Spirit evidenced in America in the past 50 years but it did not have a lasting impact. Why has it been so long? Are the heavens closed? Is the fountain dry? Do we have a hunger for God? When was the last time we experienced mourning for our sinfulness? How long has it been since we have been broken over our lack of fervor for God's presence? Have we forgotten how to be repentant of our sins? Do we long to share the gospel with the lost and are we burdened over the spiritual condition of our neighbors? The tyranny of the urgent will keep us in a fast-paced life, down a road of complacency. I pray the upcoming State Evangelism Conference (SEC) will be the start of a movement of God in our convention, because we need it. Times have changed, people have changed and the culture has changed. It is incumbent on us to seek God's face and determine the direction we must go to impact lostness in Alaska. 

Where has the time gone?

The sayings, "time flies when you're having fun" and "the older you get, the faster the time flies" both apply to me. I am getting older and having fun serving the Lord and Alaska Baptists. It seems like just yesterday I was writing my January 2014 "Builder" article and now I am writing my January 2015 article. Where did the time go?

2014 was a good year for the Alaska Baptist Foundation. On January 1, 2014, we had \$5,229,355.23 in various trusts, money management funds and endowments. As of September 30, 2014, we had \$5,857,415.73; an increase of \$628,060.50. Of that amount, \$136,862.49 is in a local credit union, and \$5,720,553.24 is invested with our partner foundation, The Baptist Foundation of Alabama.

In 2014, there was one new ministry trust and one new money management account established. We have approximately 60 different trusts, endowments and money management accounts and several other trusts are currently being established. These were created for a wide range of reasons: to assist local congregations; provide camp scholarships for


children; help bush pastoral couples with travel: assist with Vacation Bible School; help with church planting; assist with church revitalization: help

with the Valeria Sherard State Mission Offering; help those to attend seminary who have been called to preach; provide travel funds to go to Africa on a mission trip; purchase books for pastors; help with ministry above the Arctic Circle; assist with funding the Alaska Baptist Foundation; provide an appreciation gift for the wives of ministers; and to assist with ministry to shut-ins and those physically challenged. Sixty different trusts – 60 different purposes. Each one is unique and addresses a ministry or mission cause important to the person who established it.

In May, Barry Bledsoe and Nathan McCarthy from The Baptist Foundation of Alabama facilitated awareness con-

ferences across Alaska. Adam Long and I then followed up these conferences with individual meetings and church presentations.

Finding money to invest


