Alaska Baptist Convention

<u>June 3, 1942:</u> Japanese planes from two carriers bombed Fort Mears at Dutch Harbor and fighter planes strafed the fort, the Navy station, and Unalaska village. Twenty-five soldiers and sailors were killed. The Japanese made a second attack the following day. In all, 44 were killed and 71 were wounded in the two attacks.

<u>June 8, 1874:</u> Apache leader Cochise died on the Chiricahua Reservation in southeastern Arizona.

<u>June 13, 1971:</u> The New York Times began publishing the Pentagon Papers, a collection of top secret documents exposing U.S. strategy in the Vietnam War. <u>June 14, 1944:</u> Fire destroyed much of the town of Hoonah, and with it many important Tlingit cultural objects.

<u>June 17, 1953:</u> The military port of Whittier was virtually destroyed by a \$20-million fire said to have been the most costly fire in Alaska.

<u>June 20, 1940:</u> A Pan American Airways plane took off from Fairbanks. It carried mail that would be delivered mail at Seattle the next day, thus initiating the fastest airmail service between Interior Alaska and the Lower 48 states.



- Church-type missions are entitled to one (1) messenger.
- All messengers shall be resident members and in good standing of the cooperating Alaska Baptist Convention church/mission that elects them.

"Standing in the Need of Prayer"

I remember singing that song in church with my family when we were children. The message of the lyrics suggest we are all in need of daily intercession, and that includes our pastors.

My first month in Alaska has offered several opportunities to meet with pastors in Anchorage, Kenai, Mat-Su Valley, and Juneau. I am always amazed at the sacrifice many of these men make to serve in the area God has called them.

One of the greatest resources we have is our pastors who labor tirelessly in their communities, not only to lead their churches but to spearhead an evangelistic thrust reaching the darkest corners of our state. As I sense the overwhelming responsibility that rests on them, I keep asking, "How can I help you in what you are doing here?" knowing all along the answer is, "Pray for me!" But the sobering thought for me is, how many times do I promise to pray for these guys and forget to follow through?

Our pastors are one of the greatest blessings we have to offer to our local congregations and communities, but they are just as human as we are. They get tired, discouraged, frustrated and need words of encouragement. They, including our 23 church planters and three church planter catalysts, deserve to be raised to our Lord daily in our prayers. Many of their places of ministry are remote and require a great deal of travel just to reach their areas of influence. Opportunities for fellowship and "iron-sharpening" with colleagues are rare or non-existent. That's where we come in!

I challenge you to lift up our pastors and church leaders, our church planters and other Christian laborers as they seek to impact their communities for the sake of the Kingdom. Let's not give the obligatory, "Bless our pastors wherever they may be serving . . .", but let's commit to name them specifically and pray for our own pastor, the pastor down the street and the pastor in the next town or village. Let's pray that God will give them wisdom, sensitivity to the needs of their people, and strength to represent our Lord boldly and stand up against the evils they encounter daily in their places of service.

"O Lord, thank you for the faithful servants you have called out to serve in the cities, and towns, and villages of Alaska! Grant them your wisdom and peace as they proclaim the good news of salvation to a lost generation. May they lead your children boldly and stand tirelessly against the onslaught of a sinful wretched world in need of the love of the Father. Amen"

The need for church leaders is so great. With the transitional nature of our state, not only is it hard to keep church membership constant, but when leaders leave the state, it becomes a hardship for the church membership. But there is something worse than no leader....a bad leader! Skills matter! Leaders need development training with an understanding of their roles. Character counts! If a Bible study leader is not living what he is teaching, people notice. If a pastor's lifestyle does not reflect what he preaches, people recognize the message and the man do not match! The combination of skill and character makes the leader. Jesus was the greatest example of a leader for which all pastors should strive to emulate. How are you encouraging your leaders to "Lead Like Jesus"? September 8-12, 2016, the Bible Teachers/Leadership Resource Group from the State Convention of Baptists in Ohio will help us learn how to "Lead Like Jesus" and will conduct conferences in Kenai, Anchorage, Wasilla, Valdez and Fairbanks. Following a two-hour general session, we will break into smaller groups for those who work with children, youth or adults. If you have leaders (or potential leaders) for age-graded Sunday school, Vacation Bible School, Awana, or other small groups, this is a wonderful training opportunity. If your church is willing to host the event in your area, please let Betsy know, betsy@alaskabaptistconvention.com. Pastors, I encourage you to lead by example by attending this training with your ministry leaders.

Following our "Lead Like Jesus" conferences in early September, the annual meeting of the Alaska Baptist Convention will be hosted by University Baptist Church, Fairbanks, September 26-28. Watch the Alaska Baptist Milepost and the ABC website for information about registering your church messengers. In October, I am planning a retreat and conference for our worship leaders, led by Rick Muchow. Rick was our guest worship leader at the 2015 State Evangelism Conference and has a coaching and mentoring ministry, working with worship leaders across the United States and internationally. Rick's leadership and coaching style encompasses all types of worship leadership, working with various worship genres, so I encourage your worship leader to attend. In addition to the teaching time, we will focus on fellowship and spiritual renewal. Come prepared to learn, worship and experience God's presence. Additional information will be available soon.

November 5-8, we will conduct Bible Study Leadership Training facilitated by the Groups and Faith Development Team of the Georgia Baptist Convention. I have asked them specifically to address the needs of smaller churches and their smaller Bible study programs. We will also have a conference designed for churches that only use small groups. Some of our churches have no educational space, especially our church plants, and some churches intentionally strategize through a small group ministry. Whether you have a traditional Sunday school with age-graded classes or are small groupfocused, your groups matter. Make plans to join us. Seven traits of churches with increasing per-member giving

ne of the key metrics of financial giving in a church is per-member giving. Churches with increased giving per member have seven dominant characteristics.

- 1. Increased emphasis on belonging to a group. Members in a group, such as a small group or Sunday school class, give as much as six times more than those attending worship services alone.
- 2. Multiple giving venues. Per-member giving increases as churches offer more giving venues (e.g., offertory giving in the worship services; online giving; mailed offering envelopes to all members and givers; automatic deductions from members' bank accounts; giving kiosks).
- 3. Meaningful and motivating goals. Church members give more if they see the church has a goal that will make a meaningful difference. "Increasing total gifts by 10 percent" is not a meaningful goal. "Giving 10 percent more to advance the gospel in the 37201 zip code" is more meaningful.
- **4. Explaining biblical giving in the new members' class.** New member classes should be an entry point for both information on and expectations of biblical church membership. Biblical giving should be a clear and unapologetic expectation of church members.
- **5. Willingness of leadership to talk about money.** While it is possible to communicate financial stewardship in an overbearing manner, it is inexcusable for leaders to be silent about financial stewardship by Christians.
- **6. Meaningful financial reporting.** Many churches provide financial reporting that only a CPA or a CFO can understand. Church members need to be able to understand clearly how funds are given or spent.
- 7. Transparent financial reporting. If church members sense pertinent financial information is being withheld, they tend to give less or nothing at all. While that does not mean every financial



statement provides endless details, it does indicate church members will have a clear idea of how funds are given and spent.

There are reasons for optimism in church giving. Many churches are experiencing increases in total giving as well as per-member giving. And most of those churches exhibit the seven characteristics noted above.




