Highlights from the SBC Annual Meeting 2019

“Gospel Above All” was the theme for this year’s annual meeting June 11-12 in Birmingham, AL. It was refreshing to focus on what unites us in our efforts to reach a lost nation and world for Jesus Christ – THE GOSPEL. The Alabama Baptist State Board of Missions, under the solid leadership of Dr. Rick Lance, did an amazing job, under difficult circumstances, to host the event along with the Executive Committee of the SBC. Here are a few of the highlights for me personally:

WMU Conference at The Church at Brook Hills was inspiring as WMU leaders reminded us of the cooperative work of Southern Baptists in supporting our missionaries at home and abroad. That support begins with prayer and compels us to give through the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering and Lottie Moon Christmas Offering. It is always encouraging to see former colleagues who continue to faithfully serve the Lord in the places to which they have been called.

IMB Sending Celebration on Tuesday afternoon was truly a celebration of faithfulness and a time to honor 47 new missionaries who have committed to going to some of the most difficult places in the world. Over 8000 SBC messengers raised their voices in responsive chorus with IMB leaders and missionaries to commit to serve, pray for and encourage the sacrifice of these gospel messengers. The display of lighted banners highlighting regions of the world needing the gospel raised a lump in my throat and tears in my eye.

Lamenting Sexual Abuse in Our Churches: The Wednesday afternoon session highlighted a corporate lamentation of the sinfulness and sexual abuse that many have suffered at the hands of church leaders in Southern Baptist churches. I am convinced that any effort to address these problems and provide safety and protection to victims begins with a public cry of confession. There was a firm commitment made to implement specific plans to root out this evil in our midst. While it may seem strange to call this a highlight, it was a fundamental step toward healing and forgiveness.

Panel Discussions were welcome breaks to the perfunctory reporting that commands most of the time during our 2-day gathering. The discussions were conducted by

JD Greear and involved a variety of leaders and experts with years of application and experience on several major issues in Southern Baptist life. The topics were Racial Reconciliation in SBC churches, Keeping Secondary Issues Secondary (A call to unity, not uniformity), and The Value of Women in God’s Mission.

SWBTS Alumni Luncheon – I am a 2-time graduate of Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary (SWBTS) and have many family members who have attended or graduated from this seminary. Dr. Adam Greenway, the new president, assured faculty, alumni and SBC leadership that he is committed to leading the seminary to fulfill the mandate of developing leaders for gospel engagement in America and around the world.

My cup is full and my heart encouraged!

Reaching our world—or not?

Thom Rainer is an excellent communicator and I appreciate him keeping us mindful of our calling in the local church with his articles. This excerpt is rather sobering.

“I recently reported the latest statistics for our denomination. It’s not a pretty picture. Our membership declined again, this time by 105,708. And our baptisms were down to 314,956, the lowest level since 1948. But in 1948, we only had 6 million members. Today we have 16 million members. We are reaching less people for Christ, even though we have 10 million more members than we did in 1948.

Keep in mind that baptisms are our way to best estimate the number of people we reached for Christ with the gospel. When someone declares that he or she is a follower of Christ in our churches, that person is expected to follow through with baptism.

But baptisms are declining precipitously. Why?”

This should get your attention. We are more than double the number of members but reaching fewer. The sobering part is these statistics were reported in 2013. See the chart for baptisms in 2018.

I wonder what Thom would say now? In a few short years baptisms have declined from 314,956 to 246,442. This is a drastic decline and is something we have experienced here in Alaska. We are around the 400 number in

baptisms, but at one time it was in the 700s. Times change, churches change, the culture and people change, but the gospel doesn’t change. It is good news to the lost. It is the focus of the Great Commission resulting from the Great Commandment. We have to find in our hearts a deeper urgency to share Christ with others. The decline we see in baptism is a heart issue. As your State Evangelism Director, I confess that I get sidetracked by the tyranny of the urgent. I haven’t made witnessing my main focus. Our national convention has started a campaign “Who’s Your One?” This needs to be highlighted not just once in our church but, made an ongoing emphasis. This summer, with 16 summer missionaries, we are going witnessing every week. It has been so refreshing to get out and share Christ with others. I am calling for our churches to double their baptisms this year. I am calling on pastors in our state to lead the way in reaching the lost and taking their church members with them. Let’s make this a matter of prayer and ask God to increase our urgency. Please pray about your role and the actions you will take. I am with you brothers and sisters. The Good News is still Good News. Share it and leave the results to God.

The three core elements of a basic estate plan include:

1. The Last Will and Testament (Will)
2. The Power of Attorney (POA)
3. The Advanced Healthcare Directives (AHD)

In the January issue, we discussed the Will. Now we cover the power of attorney (POA). The POA plays a critical role in the estate planning process by allowing an individual to act in place of a person, as agent or attorney in fact.

There are four classifications of POA. Two cover the breadth of the powers assigned and two deal with the circumstances under which they become active.

The breadth of power are general or limited:

- **General POA** is the most comprehensive and gives a designated agent all the powers and rights that the individual himself would exercise. It becomes ineffective at the incapacitation or death of the individual for which they are granted.

- **Limited POA** grants authority to act in a limited or specific way or activity. There is usually a specific timeframe for which it is granted clearly spelled out in the document.

The circumstances under which a POA becomes active:

- **Durable POA**- this form of arrangement can be either general or limited. The instrument becomes effective once enacted and remains in force until death. Without this distinction, if a person were to become incapacitated, a court would appoint a conservator or guardian as a representative agent. This can be expensive and time-consuming.

- **Springing POA**-is a type of durable POA with the distinction that it only becomes active at the point of incapacitation. Therefore it is very important that such a document outline the specific criteria for determining what constitutes incapacitation. The vast majority of medical/healthcare POAs take this form. The springing POA is often used as the second component in the basic estate plan model.

Laws differ between states, and even financial institutions may have their own internal guidelines that affect how POA provisions are enforced.

While a "Living Trust" can substitute for some areas of both the Will and POA it is still advisable to have a POA because not all property may be titled in a trust. Further, while a trustee has authority to sell assets for medical ex-

penses they would not typically have authority to make medical decisions for the owner of the trust. A healthcare POA would still need to exist.

The importance of who serves as agent cannot be understated as that individual will have authority over finances, and healthcare. The agent should have the complete trust and confidence of the individual granting the POA. While one may think a family member, such as a sibling, would be a good choice, this is not always the case. Family dynamics can become complicated, but finding an independent third party can be difficult. Many banks and trust organizations have bonded fiduciaries who are able to serve as agent.
