- *10% to Birchwood Behavioral Health
- *5% to 2000 club promotion
- *5% to Alaska Disaster Relief

Our church jumped into action and quickly developed a program to replace it. We fed between 68 and 79 kids every Monday, Wednesday and Friday. This has been a huge ministry and the entire community has come together to support the Lord's efforts. We distributed school supply backpacks to all the kids on Prince of Wales at the end of the July, and had a great turnout to our sports camp, and VBS. We had a grand opening extravaganza on the 4th of July where we fed the island residents and provided games and fun events for everyone. Our leadership team has been growing as the Lord continues to equip us to reach our community.


Mario and Migda Morales faithfully serve in Juneau at Rescate Church sponsered by Glacier Valley Baptist Church.

Alaska Baptist Disaster Relief is a ministry of the churches of the Alaska Baptist Resource Network. Amid the Covid-19 limitations over 24 months, large numbers of Southern Baptist volunteers have responded with love, spiritual care, and action evangelism across America and around the world. Through partnerships with other disaster relief organizations, we have continued to touch lives in the year 2022.

We still believe that we can mobilize many untrained "day volunteers" from local churches and from within our communities who will pitch in at their own risk. We desire to train a few volunteers from each Alaska Baptist church in our state to (1) help guide Shower and Laundry Ministry, (2) facilitate Mud Out Operations following a home flood, (3) lead Ash Out Recovery following a house fire, (4) respond quickly, transporting a Rapid Response Feeding Unit, setup and begin distribution of hot food, and (5) offer Spiritual Care to individuals who are hurting. We need to equip a few more guides who will prepare to come alongside trained team members and spontaneous day volunteers with the leadership skills, safety training, tools and vehicles for effective response.
