What is the Valeria Sherard State Mission Offering


The Valeria Sherard State Mission Offering was established in honor of Valeria Sherard who gave her life in ministry to Native Alaskans in their villages.

The state mission offering is allocated as follows:

- *50% to state missions
- *20% to state-wide camping
- *10% to associational missions
- *10% to Birchwood Behavioral Health
- *5% to 2000 club promotion
- *5% to Alaska Disaster Relief

Each year when we emphasize the state mission offering, we are reminded of the sacrifices of our early missionaries such as Valeria, the hard work of our current missionaries, and the great need for prayer and financial support for the mission needs here in Alaska. Join us this week as we pray for just a few of the missional works that benefit from your generous giving to the Valeria Sherard State Mission Offering.


- 1. The discipleship and evangelism that was given would be bearing fruit in the campers lives.

A special word of thanks to First Baptist Church Bentonville, Arkansas for bringing a tremendous team to help host and lead our Minister and Spouse Retreat this April 20-21, 2023, at the Hotel Captain Cook. What a tremendous blessing the church, its leaders and members have been to us!

Ten Alaskans traveled to Alabama to participate in the Send Relief Serve Montgomery Tour March 10 & 11. Over 50 projects took place in 10 schools, 8 churches, and included 29 community projects. 901 volunteers participated over the weekend. 1390 Gospel conversations took place, and 13 salvations were recorded, Praise God! Over 1380 hours of Hunger ministry were performed as well as 3647 hours of construction. Many Alaska Churches are working together on various community and Gospel projects together this year in a united effort to reach our state with the Gospel. This is the goal of the apprenticeship program, to train prospective pastors to be suited for ministry in Alaska so that they can either fill a vacancy at another church or to plant a church in a needed area. In the coming year, please pray that we would see an increase in apprentices among Alaska Baptist Churches and that this would result in fewer pastor-less churches and more church plants.
